### PENSMAN takes you Behind the Spotlight

**THE DAY OF RECKONING**  
When you have fun you have to pay for it and when you have had a good time the piper must also be paid. Never before have we had it so good for Christmas. It was estimated by the Central Bank that £170 million was in circulation during the week prior to Christmas; by any standards an enormous amount of money. The spending spree is now over and the disillusionment of the Christmas period has set in. The day of reckoning is upon us. Many will find that they have overpaid and there will be more than a few sighs of regret as efforts will be made to balance the budget by cutting down on expenditure during the next couple of months. But then as I have stated everyone had full and plenty for the festive season; there was no shortage of money, if one is to judge by the volume of business done in the shops and in the bars over the almost week-long period of the festive close-down. So after the storm comes the calm and each commitment must be met and so we will stagger on until—when?  
And oh, by the way I nearly forgot—Happy New Year to you all!

**WORLD PEACE DAY**  
New Year's Day has been set aside by Pope Paul as World Peace Day and the theme of the Holy Father's message for the season is "Every Man Is My Brother."  
Since the end of the Second World War in 1945 over 100 national and international conflicts have taken place throughout the world. Some estimates place the number of people killed in excess of more than the total fatalities during World War II.  
During 1969, (the most recent year for which full figures are available) the total world military expenditure is estimated at \$200 billion which is a sum equal to the combined income of the poorest fifty-two per cent of the world's population, i.e. 1,800 million people. Between 1964 and 1969, military spending throughout the world has increased by 44% and the total income of the world's population is almost as great as total world expenditures on public education and public health combined and is fifteen times greater than the aid to developing countries.  
The arms race is now spreading to the developing countries and in some cases the military budgets in some of these countries are growing twice as fast as the world average. In 1957 no developing country had long range surface-to-air missiles; today 19 countries have them. In 1955 no developing countries had supersonic military aircraft; today 32 countries have them.  
It is reckoned that up to 1963 when the Nuclear Test Ban Treaty was signed in Moscow, the average annual number of nuclear tests throughout the world was around four. Although signatories to the treaty agreed to discontinue tests underwater, in the atmosphere and in outer space, the annual average number of these tests since the Treaty was signed has risen to forty-six! Two of the main nuclear powers, France and China are not signatories. It is a further terrifying thought that existing nuclear stockpiles already contain sufficient material to wipe out the world's population ten to fifteen times over!  
With this type of escalation which this indicates, it would appear that mankind is racing towards final annihilation and it would be well for the people of all countries in the world and especially their leaders and governments to pause on New Year's Day and reflect on the end result which this arms race can only bring.

#### Pope's Message Encourages Peace Workers

Pope Paul VI has issued a message for the Fifth World Peace Day against a background of growing violence in the world. This year's theme, "Every Man Is My Brother" will be celebrated internationally on January 5th.  
The Pope's message encourages all those who work to build peace. Whoever works to educate the rising generations in the conviction that every man is our brother, is building from the foundation the edifice of peace. Whoever implants in public opinion the sentiment of human brotherhood without reserve is preparing better days for the world. Whoever corrects the protection of political interests without the involvement of hate and of fanaticism amongst men, as a logical and indispensable necessity of social life, is opening to humanity the ever common advancement of the common good.  
Pope Paul calls on everyone to give "rational and resolute attention to the Peace Day theme 'Every man is my brother.'"  
For Christians in particular, the Pope concludes, their faith adds an extra and necessary support to the conclusions which human wisdom has reached about peace. This is the certitude possessed by all Christians based on Christ's words: "You are all brothers" (Mt. 23:8). The supreme argument for every Christian is the person of God over all men. "We know that we shall find the way to God's altar and that we have not first removed the obstacle to reconciliation with our brother man (Mt. 5:23ff. 6:14-15). And we know that if we are promoters of peace, then we can be called sons of God and be among those whom the Gospel calls blessed (Mt. 5:9)."
