Rates Can No Longer Bear Burden Of Health Services

COUNCIL'S CALL TO MINISTER

The increase of approximately 17% in the E in this year's Health Authority Estimate would cripple the ratepayers of the county it was stated by Mr. Austin Deasy at the monthly meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday when the Authority's Provisional Estimate was before the Council for recommendation. The Council decided to make no recommendation on the estimate until the Minister for Health declared what the grant structure towards the huge cost would be for the coming year.
