Introduction Of Decimal Currency - Monday, 15th February, 1971

GENERAL INFORMATION

As already announced counter services at Post Offices will be suspended from 1pm on Friday, 12th February, 1971 until normal opening hours on Monday, 15th February, 1971.

From opening hour on Monday, 15th February, 1971, the Post Office will be a "Decimal Shop." All business will be transacted and all Post Office sale items and services will be priced in decimal currency.

A complete range of decimal postage stamps will be on sale. The denominations, in new pence, will be 1, 1½, 2, 2½, 3, 3½, 4, 5, 6, 7½, 9, 10, 20 and 50. The new pence symbol "p" will not appear on the stamps; the values will be indicated by the numerals only. Post Office ordinary and registered envelopes, postcards and letter-cards bearing decimal stamps and books of postage stamps will also be available.

Leaflets showing the decimal postage and telegraph charges will be available at all Post Offices.

Postal Orders, Saving Stamps, Insurance Stamps, Inland Revenue Stamps and Forms, Income Tax PAYE Stamps, Wireless and Dog Licences will be priced in decimal currency.

Lsd Coins, Stamps and Orders for Payment Lsd coins will be accepted at Post Offices throughout the changeover period but three penny bits and old pence should be tendered in multiples of 6d so that exact change can be given.

Lsd Postage Stamps on hands may for the present be used up to prepay postage, their value in decimal currency being determined by reference to the Shipping (3p) Conversion table. Any deficiency may be made up in decimal stamps.

Lsd Money Orders, Postal Orders, Pensions and all other payment orders normally payable at Post Offices, which are presented for payment on or after 15th February, 1971, will have their values converted to decimal before being paid.

The Social Welfare Act, 1970, specifies the rates of employment contributions under the Social Welfare Act, which will apply from 15 FEBRUARY, 1971. Contributions payable under the Redundancy Payments Scheme are combined with the Social Insurance contributions and stamps at the combined rates will be put on Social Insurance cards. The combined weekly rates of insurance stamps (including, where payable, the redundancy contribution and the contribution for occupational injuries insurance) will then be:

INSURANCE (INTERMITTENT UNEMPLOYMENT) ACT, 1942. The rates of contribution payable under the above Act from Monday, 15th February, 1971, will be as follows:
