Behind the Spotlight**

A LEAP IN THE DARK
Dungarvan Urban Council have decided to go ahead with repairs and redecoration to that part of the Town Hall which they have euphemistically called "the ballroom" to occur this year. From my experience it is many, many years since the dance hall there could have resembled a ballroom in any manner, no matter how much the imagination is stretched. The Town Hall is an old building of the 17th century. Thousands of pounds have already been expended in trying to keep it some way presentable. It has been painted and repaired, touched and stained but after a short period the old crumbling walls always break through the paint coverings and ugly discoloured, pock-marked surfaces again inevitably become evident. As the saying has it there is not much hope of ever making a silk purse out of a sow's ear.

So much for the attempt at redecoration. Now there is the question of the hall's suitability as a venue for holding dances. Any of those concerned with running dances now whom I have asked about this have told me that by present standards the floor area of the Dungarvan Town Hall is too small to qualify as a modern ballroom. To meet the costs of the average bands—no mention the gigs at the top—and the other expenses of running a dance the accepted capacity of a modern hall must range from anything from 1,000 up. Due to restrictions placed on it because of the demands of the Chief Fire Officer for safety precautions, the upper limit of dancers who can be admitted to the Town Hall is 500.

I have been informed by a number of people interested in bands and dancing that for this reason there is no future in the Dungarvan Town Hall for dancing purposes and that there will be a further decline in the even smaller number of dances now held there. What then can be the justification for going ahead with plans to spend an unspecified sum of money in redecoration of the hall as a "ballroom"? At last Monday night's meeting of the Urban Council, Mr. Austin Deasy asked how much it was proposed to spend on the renovation scheme only to be informed by the Town Engineer that he had no prepared estimate and that it would in fact be difficult to estimate the cost of such a job in advance. Mr. Deasy expressed anxiety about the justification of a big expenditure on the hall and again asked whether it was proposed to submit an estimate to the Council for approval prior to proceeding. The Engineer replied that it was proposed to commence work without delay and that if they were to wait for the next meeting of the Council for approval of an estimate it would be another month off. He promised that the dance hall would be handed down, to submit an estimate for this meeting!

The only official justification expected for this type of unbusiness-like approach to this job is that no matter what costs it will have to be done! The Town Hall may be an amenity in that it is a venue for the local badminton and volleyball clubs and that it is a centre for social and a few major dances during the year. Then certainly let it be cleaned up and decorated for some social and recreational accommodation, it can be made suitable for. I believe Councillor Deasy was correct in raising the question of

the amount of money it is proposed to spend on this work at the Town Hall; the pity of it is that he did not press to have the work postponed until an estimate was first approved. Nothing can justify a leap into the dark such as the Council have now decided to take and the urban ratepayers once they become aware of the terrific increase which will undoubtedly come in the current year's rates, will be quick to find fault with this most unsatisfactory manner of spending their money.

PATHETIC PLANNING
Readers will see elsewhere in this issue a report of the monthly meeting of the County Vocational Education Committee at which, among other things, a discussion took place on proposals to extend the new school opened by the Committee at Kilmachomas less than six months ago after a cost of £52,000 to build! The ratepayers public will naturally be perturbed to learn that an extension is required within such a very short period; they will be more perturbed to read that the school was built to meet a demand which was assessed no more recently than 33 years ago!

This comes to light by an admission on the part of the Chief Educational Officer at the meeting when he stated that the school was designed in the context of the 1938 demand even though it was only completed and occupied last year. I do know that even when the construction of the school commenced a couple of years ago the authorities were aware of this fact and why they did not make one complete job of it when they were then building it to meet the full and most recent local demands is beyond normal comprehension. I understand that even at that time provision was made in the building to enable a second storey to be put on the school. Now less than six months after it was opened the school will have to be altered and on top of that a staff room assembly hall and two prefab classrooms will have to be provided as immediate requirements. ALWAYS ASK FOR POWER ORANGE

DUNGARVAN MAN IS FIRST CAPTAIN OF NEW FISHERY PROTECTION VESSEL

Mrs. Cronin, wife of the Minister for Defence, last Friday named a former British Navy Minesweeper, L.E. Gratine during a ceremony at the oil base pier at Haulbowline, Cork Harbour.

After the blessing by the Rev. D. J. Kehily, Naval Service Chaplain, the vessel was boarded by her captain, Lieut-Commander Joseph Deasy, his three fellow-officers, and 27 ratings.

The 360-ton ship is a vessel of 130 feet overall, has a beam of 29 feet, and a loaded draught of 82 feet. It is the first of three new fishery protection vessels brought from the British Ministry of Defence. The other two vessels, when they arrive, will be named Babina and Fola. The three are replacing Ireland's previous protection vessels which are now obsolete and are to be sold for scrap.

The Minister for Defence, Mr. Cronin, in the Dail on December 3rd last, said that the cost of the three ships would be in the region of £600,000.

PROGRESS OF IRISH HEART FOUNDATION
Success Of Medication Scheme

At the Spring meeting of the Cork Regional Committee of the Irish Heart Foundation held in Cork, reports on the progress made since the Foundation was set up some years ago were submitted by Mr. R. Hussey, Director, and Capt. E. Kelly, Area Representative. The Foundation now has over 100 local committees, 12 of which (including Dungarvan, Fermoy, Midleton, Youghal and Cobh) are in the Cork Region. Since it was started the Foundation has allocated over £100,000 to Irish Hospitals and Universities for research in problems of heart and kidney disease, being responsible for distributing over 400,000 leaflets and helped to organise over 300 public lectures and meetings.

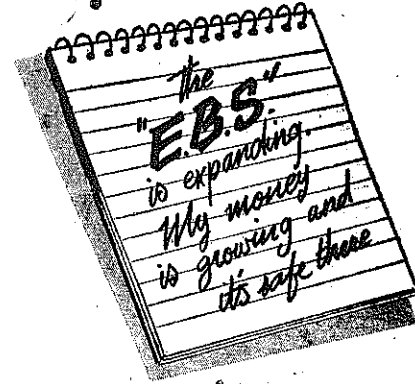
