Some years ago a visiting Consultant Paediatrician was appointed in a temporary capacity pending the establishment of the Paediatric Unit in Ardkeen Hospital and the appointment of a Permanent Paediatrician.

"The main reason for the delay in setting up the Paediatric Unit was the absence of suitable accommodation in Ardkeen Hospital. With the decline in the number of T.B. patients it was agreed, as far back as 1962, that one of the two T.B. Units would be used as a Paediatric Unit. Subsequently, however, it was decided that this T.B. Unit should become a Psychiatric Unit as it was felt that this was tome urgently required and that further consideration would be given to the question of accommodation for a Paediatric Unit.

"By 1965 there was a further decline in the number of T.B. patients requiring hospital treatment and the question of accommodation for a Paediatric Unit was then considered but was not finalised.

"Last June we wrote to the Department of Health asking for sanction to the appointment of a Permanent Paediatrician subject to the making of satisfactory arrangements for the allevation of beds in Ardkeen Hospital. The necessary statutory Orders have been made under the Diseases of Animals Act, 1966. Since June last year the Brucellosis Bradlention Scheme has also been introduced in Counties Mayo, Roscommon, Longford, Westmeath, Meath and Louth. The inclusion of North Offaly should facilitate farmers in that area whose main market for cattle is in County Westmeath.

Veterinary Surgeons are being asked to wisit every herd in the new area and to take a blood sample from every bull aged 9 months and over and every cow or heifer aged 12 months and over. The Veterinary Surgeons' fees will be paid by the Department.
