



### **SOCIAL INSURANCE** REMUNERATION LIMIT

The Government have made an Order under Section 6 of the Social Welfare (Miscellaneous Provisions) Act, 1965, with effect as from 3rd May 1971 increas ing the remuneration limit for social insurance in the case of non-manual employees from £1,200 to £1,000 a year.
