THOSE INCOME TAX EXEMPTIONS

A number of foreign literary authors, composers, song-writers and other creators of literary merit have been granted exemptions from tax on their work in recent months so that they can avail of the "no taxation on creative work" system which now operates here. Some of these are in the very high income bracket and it is on record that one of the main reasons for the exemption is that the Minister for Finance, Mr. Charles Haughey, has it in his mind to award the exemption to the author of the play "The Sweeney" which is being performed in the city of Dungarvan.

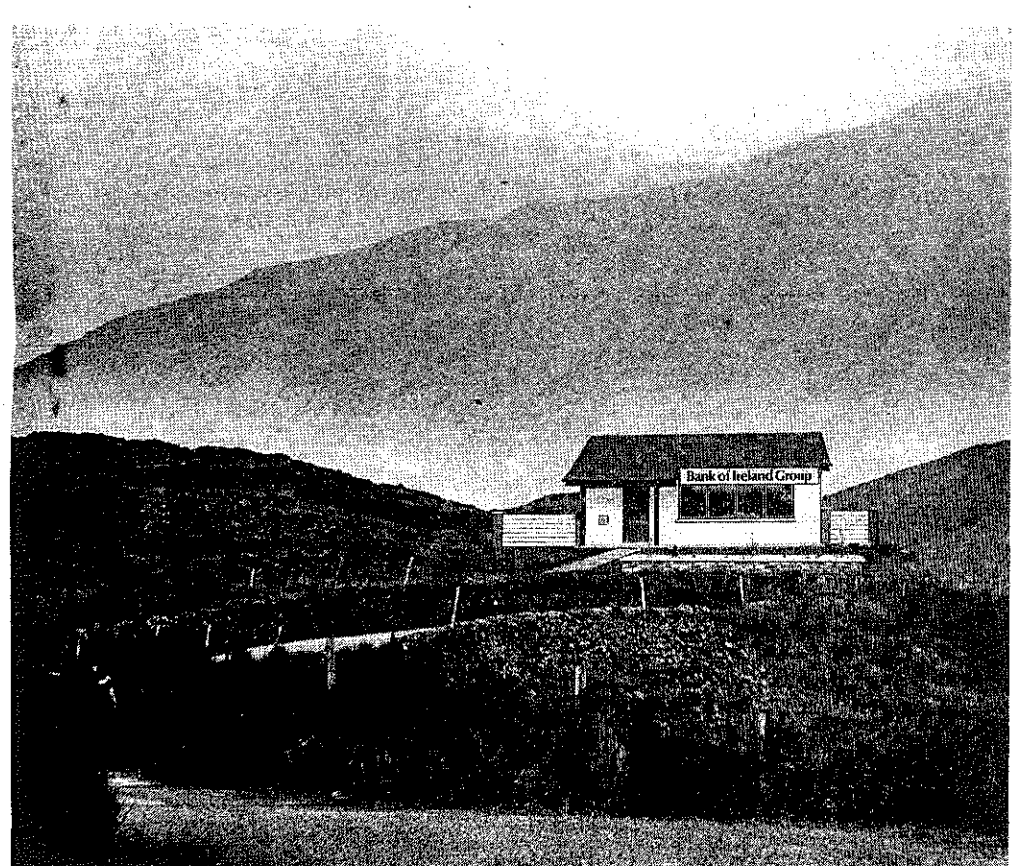

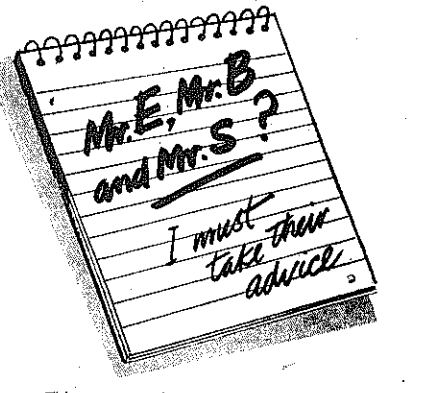
