Pensions payable are between £100 and £375 p.a. depending on number of years in the Scheme. A mortality benefit of £750 is made to dependants of warkers who die before retirement provided they are at least 26 weeks in the Scheme. Workers who are

not entered in the Scheme cannot benefit. Each worker is entitled to have his pension scheme card stamped weekly. Employers may obtain these cards from The Construction Federation Pension Scheme, 28 Earlsfort
