Eighty Threaten To Withhold Rates In Dungarvan

PROTEST AGAINST DELAY IN ELIMINATING DUMP SMELL
That 80 people, all big ratepayers had signed an undertaking giving notice that they would withhold the payment of their rates until the matter received attention was stated by Mr. P. Whelan at the monthly meeting of Dungarvan Urban Council last Monday night during a discussion on the raising of a loan of £90,000 to finance stage 2 of the major sewerage scheme being carried out in the town. This stage of the scheme will deal with the Sluiseheen and the industrial effluent from the local Creamery and Tannery. The Council unanimously agreed to the raising of the loan which will increase the town rate by approximately 20p (4/-).

VERY TOLERANT
Mr. T. Wade said that this smell did not happen overnight and the people in the vicinity were very tolerant to put up with it. If it happened in any other town he said that there would be a search on the town hall.

CONSULTANT'S REPORT
The Manager then asked Mr. N. O'Connell representing the Consulting Engineers, Messrs. E. G. Pettit, Cork, for his observations. Mr. O'Connell said that in Dungarvan the chief industrial waste came from the Creamery and from the Tannery and samples of this had been taken and sent for analysis but the results were not yet available. Having detailed the survey which had been carried out, he said in regard to the pollution problem that as a rough estimate in accordance with the figures laid down by the Institute of Industrial Research and Standards the biochemical oxygen demand of all domestic sewage to be discharged would be equivalent to a load of 750 lbs. of that of the effluent from the Creamery (at peak) 5,000 lbs. and of the Tannery 3,350 lbs. He then stated that taking the daily water consumption in the town at 1.1 million gallons (250T. for domestic purposes, 750T. for the Creamery and 100T. for the Tannery) and the trapped tidal flow that there was a sufficient capacity to absorb the domestic load plus 5,000 lbs. of the industrial load.

SHOULD HAVE BEEN ADVISED
The position of temporary clerk which was recently filled at the Vocational School, Dungarvan, was a post that should have been advertised before this was done. There can be no acceptable excuses for such decisions. could not say. After it took place innumerable telephone complaints had been made to his office, to the Town Clerk and to the Chairman that the position was extremely bad. He went on to say that they got the advice of the Consultants in the matter and a representative of the firm was present at the meeting to explain the position. Mr. P. Whelan said that he understood that these men had put back the valves which had failed out in the sluice gates at the Sluiseheen and as a result the level of the water there had dropped and the place went completely dry. There was a smell there for a time after this happened but that had now gone.

GOT NO PERMISSION
When Mr. D. Goode referred to the letter submitted by Mr. Shine as a fine gesture in civility and asked whether the suggestions it contained could be of benefit, the Chairman—Yes, but without the permission of the Manager, the Town Engineer or the Town Clerk, I don't know whether this was carried out by a private individual or as part of a project by the Junior Chamber.

The recommendation about the disinfectant pump which they had made would be sufficient to deal with the domestic sewage but they had made no recommendations in regard to the industrial effluent. At present, he said that tests and samples of these were being taken by the Consulting Engineers and when these were completed a recommendation on this aspect of the problem would then be made.
