SOCIAL WELFARE BENEFITS MUST BE INCREASED IF WE WANT TO REGAIN SIX COUNTIES

At Donegal on Wednesday Mr. Anton Bromell, a member of the Limerick City Council, speaking at a meeting through the "Six Or A City Council", made the following points: 1. The allowance paid to widows and old age pensioners must be substantially increased, but we must be prepared to pay for these increases through extra taxation. We cannot just say that it is a matter for the Government. It is a matter for us all. If we are in earnest about regaining our six Northern Counties we must at least be prepared to bring our social welfare services into line immediately with those obtaining elsewhere. 2. Poverty is a comparative thing. It is not confined, as is often thought, to the corporation housing estates in cities. There are many young people struggling to buy a house, whose income does not meet their necessary expenses. The main reason for this is the outrageous cost of buying a new house. There are also retired people whose pensions are now miserably low due to inflation. The same applies to people who had their own business, e.g. small shopkeepers whose business has been ruined by the supermarkets. 3. People have rights. If they fulfil the necessary conditions they are entitled to the benefits of the Social Welfare Acts. A Minister can get a pension or allowance or medical card for a person unless that person is entitled to it. It is, therefore, a matter of public representatives to prevent that they are responsible for getting things done for people. They can help by advising the people concerned of their rights, of the conditions necessary to qualify for benefits, by explaining their circumstances to officials and by filling in forms for them. 4. We must all concern ourselves with this question in our own parish or our own street. In the cities the older people are dying and the people are being sent out to estates in the suburbs. There was a great spirit of neighbourliness and co-operation in these old areas which is sadly lacking at times in the newer estates. There are many lonely old people surrounded by thousands of houses. All organisations, particularly the voluntary ones, should see to it that these people are visited and helped.

Tallow and Round About Notes

Tallow's 1971 Great Horse Fair Festival Will Surpass All Others — It is the Festival which will be held at the fair grounds from next Sunday, August 29th to Sunday, September 6th, the town with a special atmosphere of fun, gaiety and entertainment at its best.

Tallow Festival, founded some years ago has been praised and criticised but never ignored. It has provided colourful news copy for the news media in many places. It has become part of the lives of many in the town and has a special charm for those who have seen it. It is a very interesting one. See you there.

A glance at the extensive programme of events will give an indication of what is in store for those in search of fun and enjoyment for the next eight days. The festival has been built up around the great horse fair which will be held on the 3rd of September each year since it was founded in 1904 by the late Very Rev. W. Cannon Meagher, P.P., and leading townsfolk of that time. On the occasion of the mechanical age it was feared that the horse fair would die out. But instead it has become a very important part of the town's life.

Back to the festival at 2.30 p.m. on Sunday August 30th there will be a parade to the Castle. The parade will commence under the I.P.H.A. Rules. There will be a parade of floats, bands, and a free car park is provided. The festival will take place at the Square at 7 p.m. followed at 8 p.m. by an adult fancy dress parade with prizes money of £40. There will also be a parade of children's floats.
