




Mr. D. J. Coghlan, Waterford's representative on the National Farmers' Association National Farmers' Association National Rates Committee reported on a meeting held recently between that committee and the Revenue Commissioners in Dublin Castle to discuss the impact of the new Value Added Tax on farming. This is the standard tax in the Common Marker countries in place of turn-over tax and whole-sale tax and will be obligatory on new members. For that reason it will replace turn-over tax and whole-sale tax new January. It is innended to be a tax on consumption and not on production and its levied each time a product is sold from manufacture to final consumption or Services also are liable.

All VA.T. paid on purchases for the farm can be recovered directly and entirely if a farmer registers, If he registers, accounts must be kept and submitted to the Rewine Offices. However, it is accepted that most farmers scall a percentage increase that will recoup for him the VA.T. paid by him, This is a kind or miss method by which some

To minimise this swing the Rates Committee peoposed that the main purchases, namely manures, seeds, feeding stuffs, lime and machinery be zero-taxed, in other words, not taxed. 
