Rain fell heavily on St. Stephen's morning and strong winds sprang up in the afternoon and evening but once again became sunny.

But I think that most of the happiness was overshadowed by the terrible troubles in the North and by thoughts of so many families up there for whom there was no peace or happiness and for whom there were so many vacant chairs.

And now we are on the threshold of a new year and while I extend the compliments of the season to all readers I add the wish that God will help us to face whatever it holds in store for us.

Mr. Foley's teaching career goes back further than the 26 years he spent in Abbesside and in fact runs for over a total period of 44 years as he first qualified in June 1926.

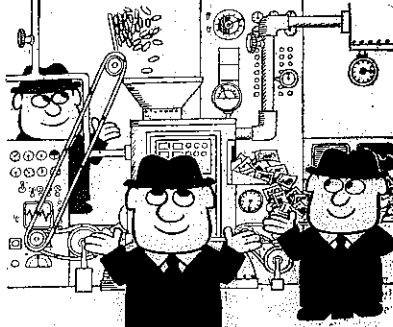
