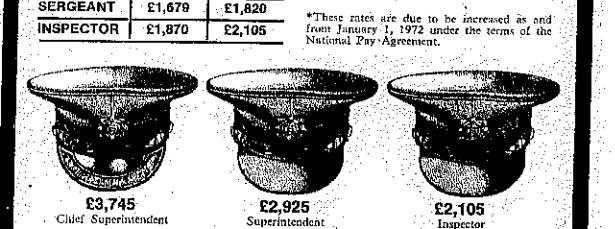

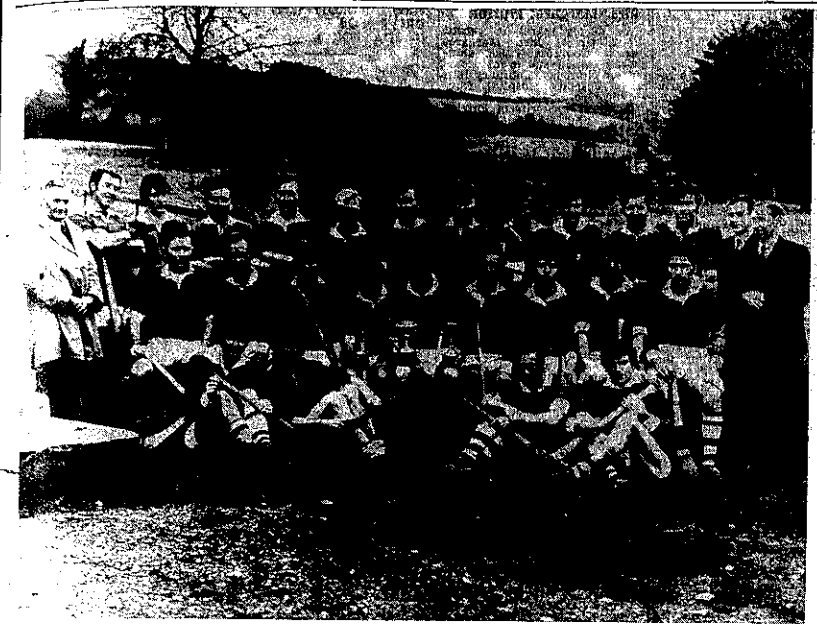

Deasy who raised the... matter at last Monday's meeting... referred to newspaper reports... which it was stated that Waterford... was the only area in the county... without a paediatric unit for the... treatment and isolation of children... with infectious diseases despite the... fact that the Department of Health... had reminded the now disbanded... Waterford Health Authority of the... situation on two occasions. He... asked whether this was true and... if so why such a unit had not... been provided.

Mr. C. A. O'Connor, County... Manager, said that he would not... regard the absence of such a unit... as a slip up on the part of the... old Waterford Health Authority. He... said that about 6 or 7 years... ago the H.A. had to decide whether... to retain some T.B. beds at Ard... keen or provide a paediatric unit... and the decision taken then was... that T.B. beds were needed. He... said that later the provision of a... paediatric unit on a regional basis... was again discussed but the vari... ous Local Authorities concerned... could not agree as to where it... should be located.

Mr. Deasy said that they in... Waterford had always boasted that... they had provided the best medical... and nursing services in the coun... try and the public were now very... disturbed to find that such an im... portant unit was missing. He... asked that the Co. Manager issue... a statement to explain the position... to the public.

The Co. Manager said that he... did not have the files of the... matter now but added that Dr... Corrigan, R.M.S., Ardkeen, had... always done his best to have a... paediatric unit established in the... hospital but there had always been... obstacles raised. The position of... a regional unit then came about... but his recollection of the matter... was that the other local authorities... involved decided to wait until the... new regional health board was... established.

Mr. T. Kyne pointed out that... they had a fever hospital in Water... ford which could have dealt with... this case but the Department of... Health had asked them some years... ago to close it as there was a... similar hospital in New Ross... which would be available to Water... ford patients and they had done so.

Mr. P. Kennedy, a member of... the Committee of Management of... the County and City Infirmary... Waterford, said that the matter of... the child's death was raised at a... meeting of their Board and it was... stated that no request had been... received to have the child admitted... to that hospital.

Finally the Council agreed that... Mr. J. Quillier, their representative... on the regional health board should... have this information placed before... the next meeting of the Regional... Health Board which is to carry... out an investigation into the mat... ter.

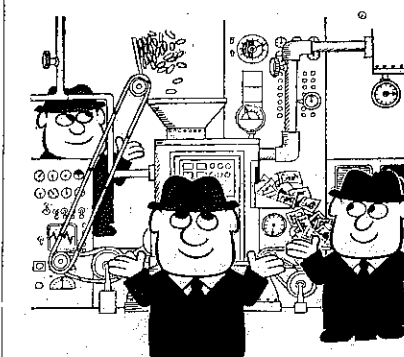
