**PENSMAN TAKES YOU
BEHIND THE
SPOTLIGHT**

MAY 10th
Wednesday, May 10, is the day on which the Irish people will vote to decide whether or not to enter the E.C. Those in favour of the E.C. are the most disastrous of the vote does not mean any way of thinking. Other hand those who do not vote to enter the E.C. are not to be taken as asserting with equal force that it will be just as disastrous for the country and the people as the majority who vote to enter the E.C. At this stage the only thing that is clear is that the people are still confused and do not know anything but their minds as what the E.C. means or what the referendum or refusal to enter the E.C. means.

The referendum should not become the playground of political parties as it is a serious matter for the country and for the people. Unfortunately it has become a political issue and a result the ordinary people are ceasing to think it is a matter of fact, the political parties have come to see the issue of this referendum as something so exclusive to their own particular field that a member of one party found it necessary at a public meeting held in Dungarvan last Monday to take exception to and to criticise the action of a priest in advising his congregation at Mass last Sunday as to what they might do. Why should not a priest speak on this matter of the common market? Surely besides the economic issues at stake there are also grave and serious moral implications involved so why should there be any reason to criticise a member of the clergy for voicing an opinion.

The decision to enter or stay out should be one for the people, made after maturely considering the facts. The main thing is for all those with a vote to turn out on Wednesday and to cast it either for or against. This is a serious matter—too serious to leave to the few so let everyone without exception turn out next Wednesday and vote and then we will have a majority decision one way or the other made by all the people.

THE COST
Incidentally it should prove interesting that it is estimated that the cost of holding next Wednesday's referendum will be roughly about £140,000. This is merely the cost of the day and does not include the cost of booklet and other propaganda.

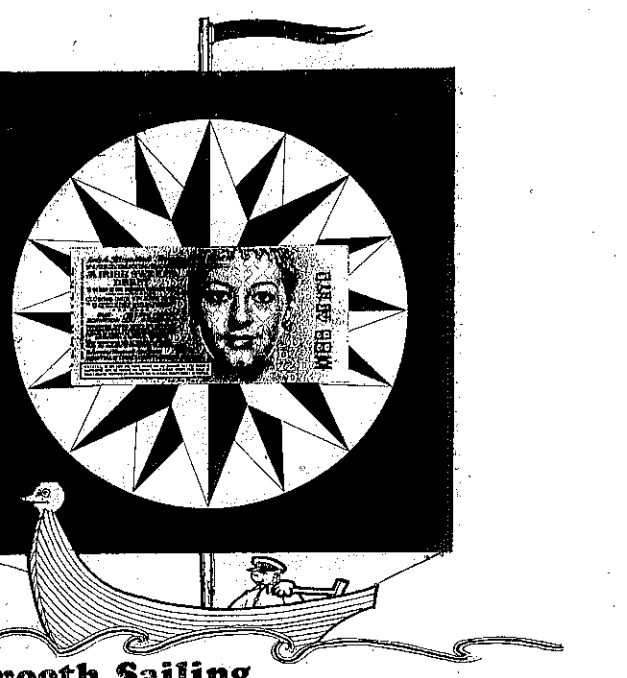

THE AUGUSTINIANS IN DUNGARVAN: 1295-1972 (FINAL ARTICLE) —By Rev. T. C. Butler, O.S.A.

DUCKPOOL HOUSE: ITS PAST The purchase of Duckpool House in 1969 evokes a curiosity about the origins and history of this imposing Georgian mansion. Built by George Boate about the year 1790, its history reflects in miniature the history of the county and of the country in general. Originally part of the Nugent-Humble estate which covered over 4,000 acres in the part of the county with its centre at Clonskeran, it was built on a farm of about 140 acres. The Nugent-Humble family were of Norman stock and are reputed to have been benefactors of the Abbey in the 13th century. They married into the Humble family around 1750 (1).

TRYING TO START CAR Noel O'Connor, Western Hill, Dungarvan, in evidence said that he was returning to Dungarvan at about 8.30 p.m. he saw a car parked on the wrong side of the road at Ballymuck with its lights on. He stopped as he thought there had been an accident and saw the defendant at the front of the car trying to start it with the starting handle. They pushed the car into the side of the road. He formed the opinion that the defendant had a "fair few drinks" taken but felt he was not qualified to say whether he was fit to drive a car or not.

THE 1826 ELECTION The years 1814 to 1829 were years of Catholic agitation concerned with the rights of Catholics to education, to hold property, to enter the professions and to have freedom to practise their religion. In short, they were years of a relaxation of the Penal Code. They found their champion and leader in Daniel O'Connell. In 1823, he founded the Catholic Association with the object of making it an organisation of the whole people and not merely of the upper classes. Brouettes were formed all over the country. John Galwey took an active part in the work of the Association by organising a branch in Dungarvan. The fruits of his work, inspired by O'Connell's leadership, were to be first put to the test in 1826. An election was due to take place in Co. Waterford as the most memorable incident in his life.
