INADEQUATE TELEPHONE SERVICES

Inadequate telephone services have been creating a serious headache for doctors in many parts of the West of Ireland in recent months and an intensive campaign is now being launched to have these improved.

Among the worst hit areas are Fermoy and north Galway where doctors and nurses have been experiencing great difficulty in making urgent phone calls because of "heavy pressure on existing lines."

According to Dr. Tom Cunningham of Tuam, the automatic dialling system is breaking down and he has appealed to the local Chamber of Commerce to have something done about it.

"He said: 'One day recently I was trying to get a Dublin number and when I had finished dialling I heard a voice saying "This is Ballyshannon." I just couldn't understand how this could happen.'

"One time I used to think that there were just two or three tones like dialling and ringing but nowadays when one picks up the phone they can hear all sorts of buzzes and howls. It is a very serious problem."

The report concludes as follows: "In an effort to highlight the seriousness of the situation the Chamber of Commerce is organising a big 'write in' protest and they expect thousands of complaints to be directed to the Department of Posts and Telegraphs."

From this report it would appear that the telephone service generally is a poor one. We have not yet progressed to the dialling system in these parts and will not, according to the Minister's reply to a recent Dail question on the matter, until early 1974. But if the report on the situation as it exists at present in the Galway area is correct we have little to look forward to in the way of improvement when the dialling system is introduced here as it is already in operation over there in the West and is stated to

WHAT EDUCATION COSTS TODAY

A few weeks ago a Dail question by Mr. Eddie Collins, T.D., Waterford, revealed the cost of providing education for a student in Secondary, Vocational and Comprehensive schools for the year 1971-72. Of the three categories of student it will be noted that the highest cost was in respect of those attending vocational schools which was £141 in respect of capital expenditure, (b) a vocational student was £176 in respect of current expenditure and £18 in respect of capital expenditure, and (c) a comprehensive school student was £151 in respect of current expenditure.

The Minister then pointed out that as many of the building schemes in the case of comprehensive schools were either just completed or in the course of completion in that year and as accordingly a full complement of pupils had not yet been begun to attend the schools the average cost per pupil was of no relevance for comparative purposes. In relation to the numbers actually in attendance he said that it worked out at £329 per head.

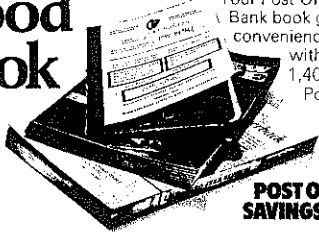

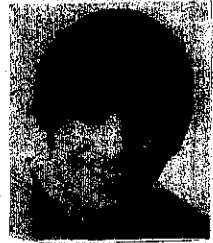
