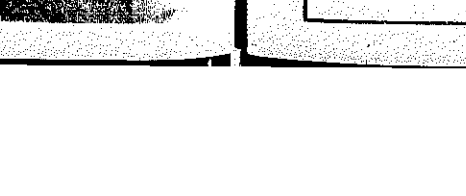
BOARD MEETING
