

LITTLE KNOWN IN IRELAND ABOUT LATE VOCATIONS

Fr. Columba Flanagan, O. Carm., is engaged in late vocation work in St. Mary's College, Aberyswyth, Wales. Since the College opened a hundred men have been ordained. When Fr, Flanagan was here a year ago we interviewed him for the "Dungawan Leader." Now, on his return visit we spoke to him ratio.

on as faunt was we spoke to him again.

Q.—Fr. Flanagan how successful was your visit last year?

A.—You will recall my work is with late vocations not with vocations in general. Little is known in Ireland about late vocations so I suppose you could say I am breaking new ground.

Q.—Do you mean that people do not know what is meant by a late vocation?

A.—I meet many who think they do but often they are fairly wide of the mark. They have the idea that a late vocation is usually a man of lifty or sixty. Or they may think a College such, as ours is a place' where older men take a shortened course in philosophy or theology.

is a jude where order that these shortened course in philosophy or theology.

Q—Are you enaking a distinction between a late vocation and a Late. Vocation College?

A—Yes, T am. Our College in Wales is for men—usually between swenty and thirty-five—who have had a poor education. Many of our men have been to only a primary or national school. They come to us, usually for two years, and take a crash course in general subjects like English. Latin, French, History, etc. We bring them up to a standard where they can enter a major seminary or novitiate.

Q—So you don't take them tight through to ordination?

A—No. Re visiting them to the

A.—No. By giving them the essentials we put them on the road. They leave us to foin the diocese or orde: of their choice. The whole point of the College is to make it pussible for men to become priess; who otherwise would not have a chance of doing so.

Q.—So you are looking for a special type of vocation, the late weation. How do you go about your work.

A.—My problem is one of communications. I believe there are many men of the kind I have described. I believe, too, that many such men do not even know of a college such as ours. My problem is in making contact with them.
