RUNNING OUR OWN SOCIETY

How much does the ordinary person care that he has no say in the running of his own society? Does it bother him at all or could he just not care less about the situation? These are questions that struck me following the last meeting of Waterford County Council at which a report made by an American firm of Management Consultants, McKinsey & Co. Inc., on the structure and staffing of our local government services was

I do not know what special qualifications the McKinsey Carporation has to look into our system of local administration and to make recommendations about it. All I do know is that they were employed by the Irish Government at considerable expense to perform this exercise and now having completed it and prepared their report it has been given the cold shoulder by practically very council in Ireland, having been totally rejected by a big number, including our own Co. Council here. Was it on exercise in tutility and was this but another instance of further waste of a great deal of good public manery? I'm afraid that I must agree that this is so. In the brief discussion on the report at the last County Council meeting, the Co. Manager, Mr. C. A. O'Connor, referred to the fact that there were far fewer local outhorities in this country than in any other in Europe and he said that to reduce this number.
