YOUGHAL OPPOSITION TO BY-PASS IDEA

Strong opposition to the suggestion that Youghal might in time have a traffic by-pass was expressed at a meeting of the Urban Council during a discussion of the revised development plan for the town over the next five years.

Assistant County Architect, Mr. H. M. Wallace, said Youghal might well be cutting off its nose to spite its face if it failed to play its part in the building of a national network of roads in the future.

Finally, on the proposal of Mr. Hennessy, it was agreed to retain the by-pass in the development plan but to give priority to the alignment of the town's back streets, keeping in mind the provision of a dual carriageway along the back route.

Mr. P. J. Linehan also criticized the development plan for its lack of improvement plans for the town's dockside.

Liam Lynch Commemoration Ceremonies at Fermoy

"Patriotism can find its expression in many ways today in building here a nation of quality in which all accept nothing that is second rate or phony. This will require efforts above the ordinary and service that will demand no personal return but the satisfaction of having played a main part as Liam Lynch did," said Seamus O'Riain, O.S., on Sunday last.

Mr. O'Riain, former President of the G.A.A., was delivering an oration at the 49th commemoration of the death of General Liam Lynch at Kilkcrumper Cemetery, near Fermoy, Co. Cork.

Mr. O'Riain said that Liam Lynch grew up at a time of national resurgence, when there was a vigorous growth of national feeling. A new vision was being presented, a vision of a new Ireland to be worked for.

The receptive mind of Liam Lynch caught the feeling of the time and shaped the vision of a free Ireland, united and strong and working out its own destiny through the efforts of its own people.

INEVITABLE COURSE Liam Lynch followed the inevitable course which led to his death on Knockmalundaw so that the ideal of freedom which he served might live on to another generation.

"The tragedy of the time is that Liam Lynch and other young men of high ideals departed so young before reaching the full flowering of their talents and without the opportunity of applying them in the building of the new Ireland. In this our country has suffered a severe loss," concluded Mr. O'Riain.

Before the official commemoration ceremony at Kilkcrumper, the very large parade gathered at Fitzgerald Park, Fermoy. Among the attendance were Mr. Jerry Cronin, Minister for Defence and Mr. J. Finlay, Parliamentary Secretary to the Minister for Agriculture and Fisheries.

COLOUR PARTY A colour party from Fitzgerald Park marched in procession to Kilkcrumper. The standard bearer was Mr. J. Condon, Commandant, Cork No. 2 Brigade, Old I.R.A. The procession was led by the Castletyons, General Liam Lynch and City of Cork Pipe Bands.

Before the oration, a decade of the Rosary in Irish was said by Dr. John O'Mahony, Cookstown and afterwards Mr. Con Donovon, M.C.C., introduced the main speaker. Wreaths were laid on behalf of the Liam Lynch Commemoration Committee: Fitzgerald Cumann, F.F., Fermoy; Mr. J. Mullins, N.T. (nephew) of Dr. Conlon together on behalf of the Lynch family; the Cork No. 2 Old I.R.A. Brigade, and on behalf of the Dublin No. 2 Brigade, Old I.R.A.

After the ceremony at Kilkcrumper, a plaque to the memory of Liam Lynch was unveiled at Kilkcrumper Camp which was then officially named Campa O Loinsigh. The Minister for Defence, Mr. Cronin, was met by Commandant S. Hennessy, O.C. Campa MacGearailt, Fermoy. Members of the 1st Motor Squadron were in attendance.

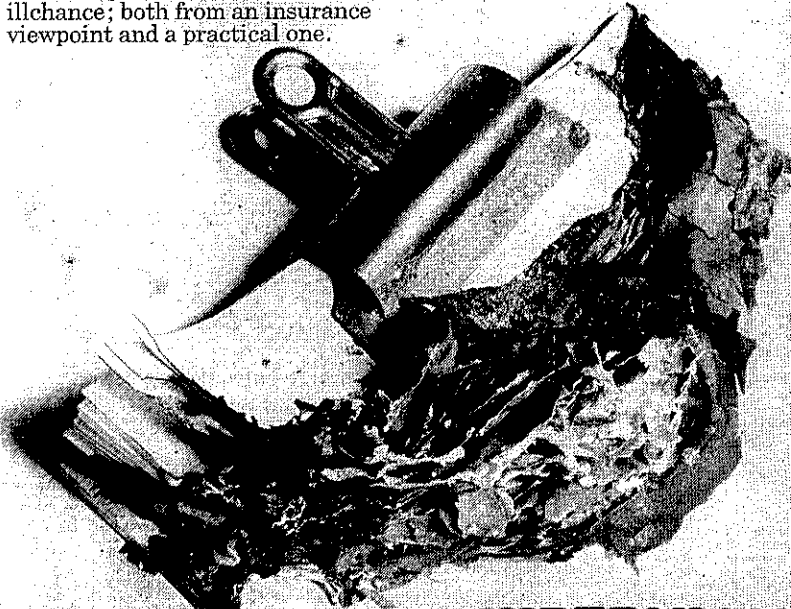
