VERY LITTLE LEFT NOW

One of the only powers left to members of County Councids after the possing of the City and County Management Act was the appointment of Rate Collectors but even this power has now been removed from the local authorities. Few will regret this latest move, however.

The announcement by the Minister for Local Government a couple of weeks agoint future appointments of rate collectors will be made on the recommendations of the Local Appointments Commissioners removes the lost element of patronage in the gift of county councils. The announcement was one which was received with mixed reelings by the members of these councils, some of whom would like to hold on to the right to appoint their own rate collectors while others will rejoice to be rid of the pressures brought to bear on them whenever such an appointment was put to a vote in the past.

For a number of years there have been no appointment so rate collectors by Waterford County Council which has adopted the office system of case collection. The merits of this system as compared with the old system operated by collectors have been discussed on a number of occasions but no case has been made to revert from the office system which has proved extremely salisfactory.
