





# PENSMAN TAKE

ROAD DEATHS STILL SHOW UPWARD TREND

The Minister for Local Government, Mr. Robert Majloy, T.D., commenting on the road accident figures for lost month, just issued by the Gorde Commissioner points out that while the figures for road fatalities show a welcome reduction to 51 compored with the month of August when 62 people died, the overall picture for the year continues to show an upward trend. With three months of the year still to run, 460 men, women and children have died on the roads, 54 more than during the corresponding period of 1971.

A preliminary analysis of the casualties shows that anceagein mater-cycle deaths ligure prominently—8 mater cyclists and two pillion passengers were killed representing 20% of the total road deaths for the month. Motor-cycle deaths have doubled in the last two months. The vast mojority of motor-cycle accounties are young people, especially those in the 16-19 age group.

The Minister appeals to porents to think carefully at the risks involved before allowing their teenage sons or daughters to purchase motor-cycles or scoaters until they consider them sufficiently nature to act with responsibility on the roads.
