PENSMAN TAKES YOU BEHIND THE SPOTLIGHT

THE RTE AND MR. FAULKNER
With influence does Mr. Brian Faulkner, the former Prime Minister of the Stormont Government, have that he succeeds so frequently in getting so much time and exposure on our national radio and television service. When anything of even the least importance happens in the north Mr. Faulkner pops up on television screens and is also heard on the radio about what he and his Unionist party plan to do. Last week when British Prime Minister Heath visited the Six Counties was no exception. Faulkner was on again in the picture and in fact got more time on Irish TV and radio than did the Westminster Chief.

It is all very sickening and one wonders at the mentality of the government and of the RTE Authorities in allowing this. At a time when there is so much conflict about banning I.R.A. "terrorists" from radio and television why is not the same regulation applied to all the other terrorists?

We all know what Mr. Faulkner is and what his attitude to this country and to the minority community in Northern Ireland is. If any man knows more about him than anyone else it is Andrew Boyd, the well-known political commentator and lecturer who is a recognised authority on the communal problems in the North.

In his book "Brian Faulkner and the Crisis of Ulster Unionism" (Anvil Books Ltd.) published earlier this year Andrew Boyd states that in all his speeches he could never find where Faulkner had ever said a kindly word about anyone and that his speeches express nothing but bitterness and hatred for his political opponents. He then goes on: "He is, in fact, the sort of politician that a troubled society like Northern Ireland could be better without, because, being the main cause of the trouble, it is impossible for men like him to reconcile Catholics and Protestants and to promote friendly relations between the people of Northern Ireland and their neighbours in the Republic."

Brian Faulkner is an Orangeman, an enthusiastic Unionist and a militant Protestant whose speeches and attitudes repelled the entire

DUNGARVAN SEA ANGLING CLUB

The annual general meeting of the Dungarvan Sea Angling Club was held on Friday, November 17, 1972, at Lawlor's Hotel and the following officers were elected for 1973: Chairman, Mr. N. The Chairman, Mr. N. Cleary in the course of his report on the activities during the past season referred to the success of the Club as a tourist promotion organisation for the town of Dungarvan as well as a Sea Angling Club and the activities of the Club were a long way towards putting the town on the map as Ireland's premier sea angling venue, both for visitors and home anglers alike.

The 3-day International Sea Angling contest had attracted a record number of anglers from five continental countries as well as English and Northern Ireland. It looked forward to an even better season in 1973 now that it was established as a permanent fixture.

The Council has certain rules about receiving deputations. In the first instance due notice must be given to the Town Clerk before the date of the meeting at which a deputation wishes to attend. Then when the members of a deputation are received at a meeting they are supposed to make whatever case they want to make and then to withdraw without engaging the Council in any discussion.

Nobody can find fault with the procedure thus laid down and indeed neither do I. But at last Monday night's meeting of the Council the separate groups were received by the Council and to say the least all the accepted procedures concerning deputations were thrown overboard.

In the first instance neither group had given the required notice of their intention to attend the meeting but the Council having agreed to waive this rule in the case of the first group, they proceeded to hear the second group. The first deputation was not long at the meeting before a full-blooded discussion in which the Council members and officials were involved with the deputation was in full swing—apparently forgotten was the standing rule to disallow such discussion.

When eventually this group withdrew the second group, which apparently was not organised but composed of young people who came separately to the meeting to make a common complaint about the Council's method of letting houses, was admitted. When the first speaker of this group made his complaint and also asked for information he was peremptorily told that he would get no answers. He and the other members of the group were then informed that they could make their case and then withdraw and that the Council would later discuss the matters raised. This they did.

To me both groups had grievances and were entitled to take whatever steps they thought fit to rectify them. But the question I would like to ask is why one group was afforded the opportunity of discussing their problems with the Council and the members of the other group were shut out? Can it be true that we still have such a distinction as first class citizens and second class citizens here or as I said at the beginning is it a case of 'fish and flesh'?

MOVE TO AMEND DUNGARVAN PARKING LAWS DEFERRED

A motion proposed by Mr. N. Kelly and seconded by Mr. D. Goode at last Monday night's meeting of the Dungarvan Urban Council asking that the recently framed parking by-laws for the town be amended to allow cars to park on one side of Main Street and O'Connell Street was deferred after a very brief discussion.

Moving the motion Mr. Kelly pointed out that the by-laws allowed for one side parking in Mary Street and he said that a new supermarket was soon to be opened in the street. As the laws made no provision for parking in Main Street or O'Connell Street he felt that this would not be fair to the shopkeepers and traders in those streets who were all ratepayers too.

Mr. Goode seconding the motion said that after the public meeting called to discuss the parking problems it had been decided to have a trial period with the new by-laws. He did not know how this trial period had worked out.

Mr. T. Ryan, Chairman, said that this trial period had not so far come into operation. He pointed out that any motion to alter the regulations now require a two-thirds majority to carry it.

Chairman—I don't know.

The Chairman said that the signature of the Minister was still required before the by-laws could be enforced and he expected that this would be provided before Christmas. The trial period to see how they would work would then start and he suggested that the motion might be deferred until they saw the results.

£20 FINE FOR CARELESS DRIVING AT DUNGARVAN CIRCUIT COURT
A 31 years old labourer, Thomas Fitzgerald, Ballinroad, Dungarvan, was fined £20 at Waterford Circuit Court yesterday for careless driving. The trial was conducted on a charge of careless driving by Raymond Cantwell, Ballinroad, on April 2nd.

The defendant had pleaded not guilty but after the judge heard evidence from the prosecution and the defendant's own evidence, he found him guilty of the charge. Judge Sean Mac D. Fawcett imposed a fine of £20 on the defendant or in default two months imprisonment.

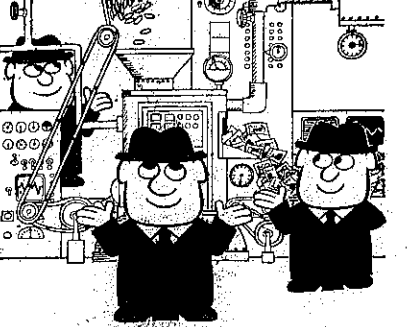

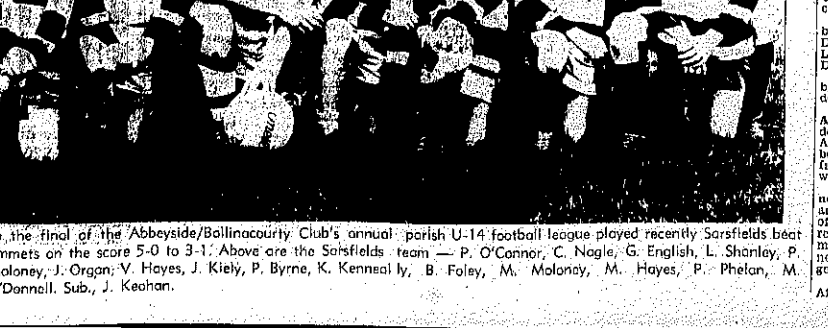
