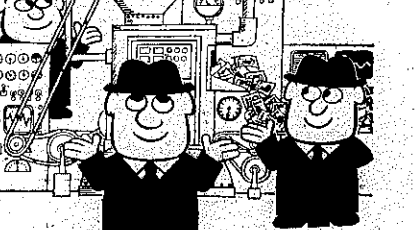

PENSMAN TAKE

A CHRISTMAS WISH In this issue prior to Christmas it is traditional to extend to all readers my best wishes for a happy and holy Christmas but with so many dreadful happenings here in Ireland and throughout many parts of the world it might appear to be somewhat out of place to wish you a happy time while so much tragedy, misery and human suffering is all about us.

It has been a terrible year for Ireland and hardly a day goes by without reports of brutal murders, bombings, shootings. We have become so brutalised by the desperate situation that we now hear these things on our radios or on our television screens and in our papers almost every day with little or no feeling or concern. Men and women are in jails and concentration camps in their hundreds, families have been broken up and homes burned down and destroyed. It is impossible to assess the cost in terms of human tragedy and suffering.

It is only right that we should not forget these things even at a time like Christmas when goodwill and peace should be the things uppermost in our minds. All we can do now is to pray that sanity and order will return soon to our country and that peace and goodwill towards all men will again replace the present hatred, bloodshed and killings.

ARE BLOOD TESTS INfallible? Much publicity has been given in recent months to the new method of proof in the case of motorists charged with driving while under the influence of alcohol and who are charged with driving without a licence. These blood tests subsequently show an alcohol concentration in the blood in excess of the legally permitted amount. However, it is well known that motorists who agree to submit to such tests could well be ruining their chances of avoiding the disqualification which is a sine qua non when a conviction is recorded.

For all blood samples are sent to the Medical Bureau of Road Safety in Dublin and, while error where the Bureau is concerned is the exception rather than the rule, the victims are based on the findings of the Bureau. Under the Act it is the option of a defendant to ask for a doctor of his own choice to examine him and take blood tests; one for the authorities and one which he can retain for private analysis. But in regard to the latter it is virtually impossible for the private individual to have a sample of his blood privately tested. Therefore those who opt for the blood test have the efficiency of the Medical Bureau to rely on.

The need for such a service to facilitate those who might wish to have blood samples privately analysed when they come under the notice of the law or are charged with a crime is stressed by the case of a defendant in Cork recently who called in his own doctor and had a sample of blood sent to Galway for analysis. The results were tipped enough in his favour to quest a court conviction and thus keep his record clean.

While we do not wish to be taken as condoning drunken driving - there are order-line cases where the official tests succeed in only slightly tipping the scales against the defendant and the resultant disqualification can mean a great deal of hardship. It is only in such cases that a second, independent test could prove of use.
