

## **EEC Dairy Herds** Conversion Scheme

The Minister for Agriculture and Fisheries has made Regulations bringing into operation the EEC Dairy Herds tions made by the Council and Commission of the European Communities The Scheme provides for payment of a premium to a producer with a minimum number of dairy cows who gives up all supply of milk and milk products for a period of four years while maintaining on his holding at least as many units of adult cattle as he had on the reference date which has been fixed at 30 June 1978

The minimum number of dairy cows which a producer is required to have had on 30 June 1973 is eleven in Counties Dublin Limerick Tipperary and Waterford and five in a region comprising the following counties Carlow Cavan Clare Cork Donegal Galway Kerry Kildare Kilkenny, Laos Leitrim Longford Louth Mayo Meath Monaghan Offa y Roscommon Sligo Westmeath, Wexford
