Improvements and extensions to Social Insurance mean changes that will affect all employers. This advertisement highlights the main changes for your information. Please read it carefully There will be a further advertisement explaining the new provisions to employees.

At present, employees in non-manual jobs are not compulsorily covered by Social Insurance once they earn more than £1,600 a year This limit will be abolished on April 1, when all such employees must be insured no matter what they earn.

Benefits

The vast majority of employees will then be covered for the full range of social insurance benefits men and women in the manufacturing, commercial and service industries and agricultural workers Employees with permanent, pensionable jobs in the public service will be covered for widow's and orphan's pensions, deserted wife's benefit and occupational injuries benefit only

Insurance cards and stamps

As an employer, you are obliged to see that each of your employees has a Social Insurance Card by April 1. and that it is duly stamped

How to get insurance cards

Any Employment Exchange or Employment Office of the Department of Social Welfare will supply application forms for employees not now holding Insurance Cards When the employee has filled in the form it should be sent back to the office that issued it

Employment Exchanges can also arrange to make bulk issues of Insurance Cards, if you make your application without delay Your letter should specify separately how many men and how many women employees will need cards If you are located in Dublin City or County - or if your head office is located there contact The Manager, Employment Exchange, Lower Gardiner Street, Dublin 1, (Phone 46501), otherwise contact your nearest Employment Exchange

Remember, it is your responsibility as an employer to ensure that all your employees have Insurance Cards by April 1

* The employer pays the health contribution only in the case of employees who hold Medicai Cards otherwise the contribution is paid by the employee

Pay-related contributions

Employers and employees will pay an additional contribution from 6th April 1974 amounting to 3% of each employee's current earnings assessable to income tax under Schedule E Your share as employer will be 2%, the employee pays 1% However, there is a ceiling of £2,500 a year above which no contribution is required In other words, the maximum any employer pays is £50 a year per employee, and the maximum for any employee is £25.

These contributions (except in the case of Government Departments) will be collected under the PAYE system by the Revenue Commissioners, you should already have received instructions about it from the Collector-General

If you are not registered for PAYE, apply at once to your local Inspector of Taxes For employers in the Dublin area, the address is Inspector of Taxes, Dublin General District (Employers' Division), 14/15 Upper O'Connell Street, Dublin 1

If for any reason an employee's earnings cannot be ascertained (because you were not registered for PAYE, for instance), you may be asked for a certificate of his or her earnings

To ensure that claims are paid promptly, employers should make their PAYE returns (Form P 35) to the Collector-General immediately the tax year ends.

STEPS TO TAKE NOW

- Check the number of your employees earning £1,600 or more who will be coming into insurance.
- Get an application form for an insurance card for each, from your local Employment Exchange or Employment Office. Have the employees complete them and return to the office of issue.

- If you are not a PAYE-registered employer, apply immediately to your local Inspector of
- Check that you have received instructions from the Collector-General about deducting pay-related contributions for the scheme under PAYE. Study them carefully.






