in Dungarvan and was a member of the Waterford team which won the All-Ireland hurl ing title in 1948, was employed as a supervisor by the company and as a result of his accident on December 19 1968 he lost the sight of both eyes
It was stated that Mr
Goode's life had been ruined and he would require nursing and the services of a compan-ion to help him in his blindness He would continue to suffer constant pain in his eyes He pleaded that it was part of his duty in the acid department to draw off from a barreltype of container a quantity of acid and for that purpose he was required to remove the top from the container and insert a siphon

While doing this work a quantity of the acid splashed up and struck him in the face




