Hard Fought "Derby" Clash With Abbeyside

Dungarvan 3-6, Abbeyside 2-7
For if any in the sparse attendance could visualise a Dungarvan victory three-quarter through this first round minor hurling championship clash with Abbeyside at Dungarvan's Fraher field on Sunday night last.

For at this stage of a hard and intensely fought local derby the Village side looked odds on winners with a double score (2-6) to 1-3 advantage.

Up to this Abbeyside had held a slight edge throughout the field as Dungarvan, pre-match favourites struggled to regain the early initiative which a Tiger Whelan fifth minute goal had given them.

Dungarvan looked good in these opening minutes but when Liam Enright goalied for Abbeyside after six minutes the Blues edged and came close to total capitulation.

No Abbeyside points from Eddie Cashin frees and a point from play from Marty Kieley followed before Dungarvan had their second score, a Michael Sheridan point in the 24th minute.

But the most fortuitous score of the game came Abbeyside's 1-2 two minutes from the break as an Eddie Cashin shot from the net ended up in the Dungarvan net.

This was a shot which goalkeeper Patsy Hackett should have topped. He got his hurley to the ball but his concentration were upset by a lack pedalling defence which he had little cover in the circumstances, and which indirectly brought about this major score.

Abbeyside were quick to take advantage and J Beattie added a point to let them 2-4 to 1-1 clear at the break.

BENEFIT OF DOUBT
It was Abbeyside who continued to command after the changeover and Marty Kieley got the benefit of the doubt with a point that looked well wide but which he was awarded a point. The same player added another point from a free after six minutes and it looked as if the Village side were on the way to a win.

LABOUR COURT REJECTS SCHOOL BUS DRIVERS' CLAIM

The Labour Court in Dublin last Friday found that no valid grounds had been established to sustain the claim of 550 school bus drivers who have been on unofficial strike for over three weeks to have their pay brought up to £25 a week.

The Court rejected the claim, put forward by the Federation of Rural Workers, for parity with service bus drivers, based on a minimum working week of 20 hours a cleaning allowance of £1, a washing allowance of £1.50, and parity with service drivers conditions as regards free passes and protective clothing.

A charge that some CIE district managers had used the fact that the strike was 'official' to attempt to scare some of the drivers back to work was denied by CIE A spokesman for the company said it was 'highly unlikely' that any intimidation had taken place.

QUESTION ON DUNGARVAN CASUALTY SERVICE RAISED IN DAIL

At Question Time in the Dail Mr E Collins F.G. asked the Minister for Health if he will take steps to ensure that there exists there at present and if he will make a statement on the matter.

Mr Corish The Deputy will be aware that statutory responsibility in this matter rests with the South-Eastern Health Board. I am advised by the board that they are not aware of any unsatisfactory position regarding the provision of a general practitioner service at week-ends. They have entered into agreements with four medical practitioners for the provision of general medical services in the Dungarvan area. It is a condition of the agreement in each case that the doctor provides services at the week-ends or arrange for their provision by another doctor.

YOUGHAL LICENSING CHARGES ADJOURNED

During the night of November 24 last and into the early hours of the following morning, ducks and drakes were attempted to be played with two gardai in their attempts to ascertain whether or not a breach of the licensing laws had taken place. District Justice B J Carroll stated at Youghal Court last Friday.

Before the court was Thomas Howlin publican Tallow Street, Youghal and he was charged with breaches of the licensing laws at 11.40 on the night of November 24 and again at 3.55 a.m. on November 25. He was further charged with failing to admit members of the gardai on both occasions.

When District Justice Carroll intimated he would at least convict Howlin on the charges in relation to the night of November 24 Mr P Kelly solicitor urged that all of the charges be adjourned to the next court to enable him to produce defence evidence in relation to the alleged offences in the early hours of the following morning.
Granting the adjournment of all charges the District Justice remarked that they were most serious ones in view of the endorsement question.

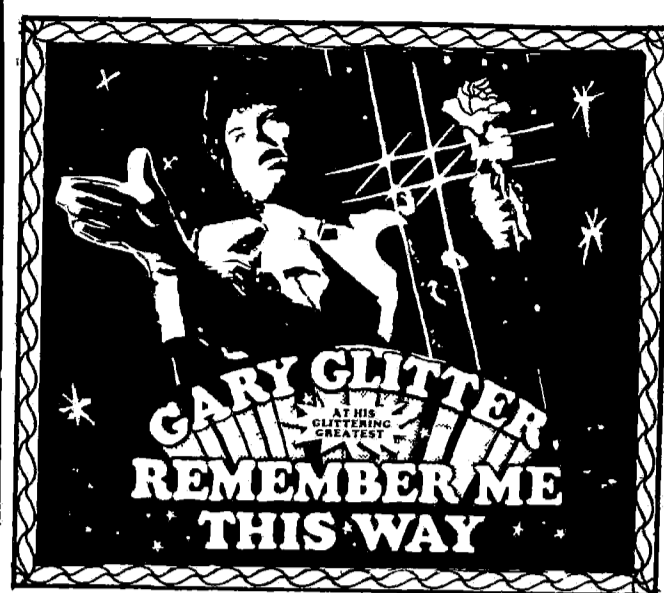

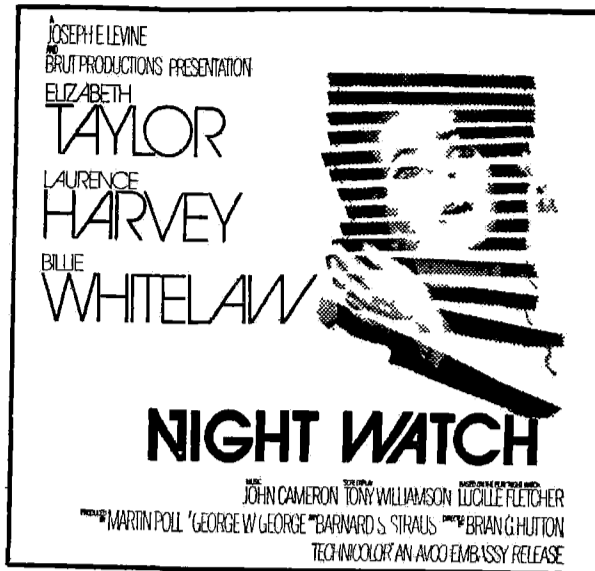
