



Dental Benefit

Notice for the information of insured persons

Persons whose employment is insurable for the full range of benefits under the Social Welfare Acts are eligible for Dental Benefit if they satisfy the contribution conditions. These conditions are

(a) Where the person is under the age of 21, that not less than 26 employment contributions be paid in respect of the person since entry into insurance and

(b) Where the person is aged 21 or over that not less than 156 contributions be paid in respect of the person since entry into insurance and also that not less than 26 contributions be paid or credited in respect of the person in the contribution year governing the claim

A person who was previously in employment that was insurable for the full range of benefits under the Social Welfare Acts and whose employment again becomes so insurable from 1 April 1974 may have the contributions previously paid taken into account for the purpose of reckoning the 156 paid contributions. As a transitional arrangement contributions may be credited for the purpose of satisfying the second contribution condition mentioned Treatment under the Dental Benefit Scheme is provided by practising dentists who have signed an agreement with the Minister for Social Welfare to provide such treatment. All insured persons who are insured for the full range of benefits and who satisfy the contribution conditions are therefore eligible for Dental Benefit under the terms and conditions of the agreement signed by each dentist with the Minister
