## MT. MELLERAY COLLEGE **CLOSES FOR** GOOD THIS WEEK

When the Intermediate and Leaving Certificate examina-tions conclude this week, one of Ireland's most noted educa-tional seminaries, that of the Cistercian Order at Mount Melleray Abbey near Cappoquin will close its doors for good

The decision to close down the secondary college at the Abbey was taken by vote of the community as far back as April 16, 1973 But it was agreed at the time that rather than have an immediate closure the col-lege should be phased out and finally cease to function at the conclusion of the 1974 June examinations

### GLORIOUS ERA

Now the end of a glorious era is at hand, an era that dates back over 130 years Already most of the eight full time lay teachers at Melleray have found replacement posts although the lay staff were known to be strongly opposed to the proposals to close the college They had had the most protracted negotiations with the Lord Abbot Rev Dom Paul Hennessy and the Community about the decision to close and fin-ally accepted that the decision was "an irrevocable one

Already the Lord Abbot has gone on record as saying that the decision to close secondary college was taken only after a year of investiga tion and six months of intensive discussion within community It is known too that architects reports and estimates of present and future prospects have been studied in the greatest detail before the final decision was taken
