The period during which a woman must be deserted by her husband before being eligible for payment is being reduced from 6 months to 3 months. If you have been deserted by your husband for three months or more you may be entitled to a deserted wife s benefit on either your own or your husband s insurance or to a deserted wife s allowance if your means are within the limits laid down

Relaxation of contribution conditions for Deserted Wife's Benefit Deserted wife s benefit is payable if the husband s

or the wife s insurance meets a certain standard Up to now this standard related to insurance between 1953 and the date of desertion From now on insurance prior to 1953 may be counted Alternatively title can from now on be established if there is a yearly average of 39 contributions over the three or five years prior to the date of desertion Additional Allowance for disabled deserted Wives






