Slaughter Premium for Certain Adult Cattle

Parallel to the premium to be paid from 5 August, 1974, by the UK Government as authorised by EEC, on certain adult slaughter cattle (including live cattle imported from this country), EEC authorised a premium for similar cattle slaughtered in Ireland towards the cost of which FEOGA will contribute

The Government has now decided to pay the premium on cattle slaughtered here at the same rate as paid in the United Kingdom, viz £9 24 per head in August

The premium is payable on steers, herfers and certain bulls of minimum qualifying standards (including weight) which are slaughtered under Departmental supervision at meat premises Excluded from the premium are (a) all caws, (b) cattle sold to intervention and (c) cattle from Northern Ireland certified there for UK premium

The premium will be paid at all registered export slaughtering premises and, where feasible, at premises at which large numbers of cattle are slaughtered for sale on the home market. These latter must be premises at which slaughtering of old cattle are already being inspected ante and post mortem by a Local Authority Veterinary Officer, which are suitably equipped for weighing the carcases and at which other relevant requirements can be fulfilled

The premium is intended for the benefit of cattle producers and will be payable in addition to the market prices normally payable by the slaughtering premises themselves for the cattle. The slaughtering premises must show separately on the price returns to their suppliers the amount of the slaughter premium period
