MOTORISTS ASKED TO CO-OPERATE

An official notice published in this paper last week from the Dungarvan Urban Council informed the public that the new traffic and parking bye-laws are now enforceable in accordance with the traffic signs erected and the road markings laid down in the town. These signs and markings have been in evidence for some considerable time but the amended bye-laws have now only been invested with the power of law. However they are now approved by the Garda Commissioner and are enforceable from now on. The schedules have already been published and are in three sections. The first schedule sets out the streets or portions of streets in which parking is prohibited during business hours, the second gives a list of parking places where parking is limited to one hour during business hours and the third schedule sets out the places where parking is prohibited at any time. The first and third schedules are subject to the proviso that the bye-laws affecting the areas concerned are enforceable "except while taking up or setting down passengers or loading or unloading goods".

unsuspecting motorists off the main road and down to the seafront at Abbeyside through Sarsfield Street. When I inquired how long this had been so I was informed that this particular sign has been pointing in the wrong direction for more than a year and that in that time hundreds of British and Continental visitors motoring from Rosslare to Cork had been sent astray by it! There are surely others doing similar damage. Occasional checks should not be beyond the capacity of whoever is responsible for erecting and maintaining these so very important signs.

U.S. BOUND ON COMHALTAS TOUR

The third annual U.S. tour of Comhaltas Ceoltóirí Éireann will commence in Mineola on next Thursday, October 10, and there will be fourteen other concerts in Boston, Waltham, Cleveland, Cincinnati, St. Paul, Denver, St. Louis, Chicago, Detroit, Montreal, New Haven, New York, Philadelphia and Bayshore, Long Island where the final concert is scheduled for the Monsignor Purck Hall on Sunday, October 27, before the tour party again returns to Ireland.

A senior Garda officer with whom I spoke during the week stated that the fullest co-operation of motorists would be needed if the bye-laws, framed to ensure as far as possible, a free flow of traffic through the main streets of the town, were to prove fully effective. He said that the laws would be enforced, generally, with reason but subject to the will of co-operation of the public. However he added that if motorists refused to co-operate within a reasonable period then the law would have to step in and take its course. I do not think that anyone can find fault with this approach. We all know that we have a traffic problem in Dungarvan (what town hasn't got one you may well ask). Whether it is to be solved partially or wholly is, in the first instance, now a matter for the public. I add my voice to the appeal made by the Garda authorities for the fullest co-operation in obeying the regulations. The traffic signs and the road markings are there for everyone to see. Let us hope that they will not only be noted but also observed in an adult, co-operative manner.

WRONG WAY FINGER POSTS

It is really only when you move into strange country driving a car that you appreciate the true value of well sign posted roads. Road maps are a very essential part of the traveller's kit also but unless they are complemented by adequate and properly located finger posts they can lose a great deal of their value. During the past month I found myself motoring in unfamiliar areas in the west and in the midlands and during these journeys the extent to which a motorist must place reliance on these finger posts was brought home to me afresh. The damage that a finger post pointed in the wrong direction can cause may well be reckoned then against this background. Surely you might be pardoned for thinking that there are no such things or that no one would be so ill-disposed as to interfere with a sign post. Local people do not pay much attention to these sign posts in their own localities as they know every bend on every road for miles in all directions. But look again the next time and check. During the past few weeks I saw one placed at a very important road junction at Catty's Corner at Abbeyside. There is a sign post with five directions on it there but he one stating that Cork is 48 miles distant sends

THE MIDDLEMAN AND WHAT HE MAKES

My recent reference to the profit made by the middleman for handling various lines of produce from the time they leave the producer until they reach the consumer has brought reactions which indicate that the margins of profit which they exact from the transactions are certainly far in excess of what should be accepted as normal and reasonable.

I am sure that housewives have seen during the past couple of weeks how the price of meat has dropped. This was brought about only by extreme pressure and by the adverse publicity which the high prices being charged by butchers as compared with the low prices which farmers were getting for their cattle was given. We also referred to the price of home-grown apples and I have been since informed on the best available authority that for last year's crop the producer got a mere 3p per apple! The co-operatives which collected the crop and graded, packed and stored the apples received on foot of these operations 128p per apple. Yet when the apples went on sale in the shops, the average price be-

TRAGIC DEATH OF MR. JOHN O'BRIEN, GRALLAGH

People in town and country both far and near were shocked when news spread last week of the tragic death of Mr John O'Brien Grallagh, Grange, which occurred as a result of an accident on his farm on Wednesday evening, September 25th.

Mr O'Brien who was aged 54 was making silage when the fatal accident occurred. He was reversing the tractor which he was driving when it slipped off a cement platform which had been placed on the ground and overturned on its side pinning him underneath. Dr J McNamee Ardmore was at once summoned to the scene but when he arrived Mr O'Brien was found to be dead. The body was then removed to the District Hospital, Dungarvan, where a post mortem examination was carried out.

Mr O'Brien farmed extensively at Grallagh and was one of the best members of the farming community in the county. His father was a founder member of Dungarvan Co-op in 1921 and deceased later became a member of its finance committee. When Dungarvan merged with four other Co-ops the late Mr O'Brien became a member of the new Board. Earlier last week he attended the funeral of a long time associate, the late Mr J. H. Folan, general manager and secretary of the Dungarvan Co-operative Society.

Mr O'Brien is survived by his wife Eileen (nee Curran) and three daughters to whom as well as to the other bereaved relatives deep and sincere sympathy is extended in their tragic bereavement.
