Behind the SPOTLIGHT

THE COUNTY RATE

Under the new change in the financial year which now brings it into line with the calendar year commencing on January 1, in order to conform with EEC rules, County Councils and other local rating authorities are presently busy in finalising their budgets for 1975. Here in County Waterford the County Council will meet in Dungarvan on next Monday to consider their financial commitments for the year and to strike a rate.

The current County rate of £5 16 which was struck last February covered a nine months period from April to December to enable the changeover to the new accounting year to commence on January 1 next and from then on it will once more be a full year of twelve months. The estimates which the County Council will consider next Monday and which have been recommended by the Council's Estimates Committee will require a general rate of £6 47 for 1975. This is an increase of £1 31 over the rate for the current period but only 63p over the rate for the last full financial year which ended last March. While it may be admitted that this increase in the rate for the next 12 months is well within reason (compared to a rate of £5 16 for 2 1/3ths of a year) small farmers especially who have been getting it tough will find any increase, no matter how reasonable, very difficult to bear.

DUNGARVAN'S NEW HOME FOR THE ACTIVE ELDERLY

One of the most important items on the agenda for the monthly meeting of the County Health Committee which will take place on tomorrow (Friday) night will, I understand, be the choice of name for the new home for elderly people which has been unofficially opened in Dungarvan within the past few weeks. I say "unofficially opened" because, while the home has become almost fully occupied, it is hoped that in the near future a date will be fixed for the official opening which is expected to be performed by the Taoiseach and Minister for Health, Mr Brendan Corish, TD.

A name was, in fact, previously chosen for the home but it had to be dropped when it was found that a private house in the area was already using the same name. In keeping with these modern, ecumenical times, I understand that the usual procedure of calling it Saint something-or-other will not be followed and we can only act and see what the members of the Health Committee come up with now.

As I briefly stated last week I was given a Cook's tour of the new building and saw the wonderful comforts which have been provided in it for those whose good fortune it will be to live there. The health authorities have undoubtedly succeeded in the aim of completely changing the atmosphere which has been associated with geriatric hospitals in the past and gone forever, at last, to that atmosphere which permeated County Homes and made them drab, rather hopeless places.

The new home in Dungarvan has 40 beds, evenly divided between males and females. There are single rooms and some three-bedded rooms all with washhand basins, bed-side lockers and built-in wardrobes. In each of the wings there is a small living-room where the residents may conduct private business or speak to visiting friends. Bathrooms and toilets are also available in each of the dormitory areas.

There is a bright spacious lounge with television on the left of the large entrance reception area while the dining room is to the other side and here meals are served at tables seating groups of four. Off the

diningroom there is a fine modern kitchen with all conceivable conveniences and serviced by several store-rooms. The building is centrally heated throughout.

The single storey complex is of square design with the sleeping quarters along the wings and rear corridor. The diningroom and lounge occupy the front wing for the most part. These surround a central enclosed recreation space, ideal because it is sheltered from all angles. Included in the building also are two special nurses and doctors rooms.

The design and interior decoration are indeed a credit to the Architects, Messrs Buchan, Kane and Foley while the manner in which the construction work has been carried out and finished speaks volumes for the expertise of the builders, Messrs E O'Brien & Sons Ltd, Dungarvan.

One other comment I would like to make concerns the fine, open tarmacaded forecourt which is fronted by a low wall so that the new building is clearly visible from the roadway. Could we now not have the same situation across the road from the new home? I refer to the often expressed recommendation that the height of the huge wall which fronts the District Hospital and County Home be reduced to open up the view at this side. In addition to removing the rather ugly wall this would be an added safety factor especially for ambulances and other vehicles leaving the hospitals and moving on to what is now a very busy road which carries a much greater volume of traffic since the advent of the Glass factory to the area.

WHERE DO THEY STAND

The high standing in the community which members of the medical profession generally enjoyed because of their benign attitude of being willing to heal the sick regardless of the cost seems to be fast slipping away as doctors, through their union and association, placing a higher and higher value on their professional capacities, seek to drive harder and harder bargains as they seek more money for their services in addition to more leisure time.

Everyone will agree that the labourer is worthy of his hire and that the professional man, in whatever field, is entitled to his fee but in all cases the demands must be fair and just and related to the ability and the means of those who have to foot the bill.

The latest turmoil in the medical field which affects most of our people arises from the most recent demands of the doctors to increase their fees under the choice of doctor scheme. It has been estimated that it would cost an extra £7 1/2 million in a full year to concede the demand by the GPs for an increase in basic fees to £2. It is also understood that no provision can be made for this amount in the forthcoming budget except by a reduction in the number of medical card holders and this is where the general public will be worst hit, if the doctors' demands are to be met.

The Irish Medical Union has declared that its members will "black" the choice of doctor scheme unless their demands are met but there are indications that the Irish Medical Association which caters for another group of the medical profession would refuse to support such a move.

According to an editorial in the "Irish Medical Times" of last week there would appear to be little hope of the doctors' demand for a 150 per cent increase in fees under the scheme being met in view of the Minister for Health's warning to the annual conference of the Irish Nurses' Organisation where, in an obvious reference

to the doctors he said "No profession within our health services can hope to impose its will on the government, when the government simply cannot in the public interest meet its demands."

Are doctors badly paid for their services to the community at the moment or how much money do they make in a year? Whatever the opinions which might be expressed in regard to the first part of the question (and I doubt that many would agree that they are), there is one thing certain about the second part and that is that no one knows and the medical union and association have shown little inclination to even estimate what the income of a doctor in the public service combined with a reasonable private practise is.

A well-known political commentator attached to one of the leading Dublin papers wrote in his column last week that a little gossip line doing the rounds had it that TDs were thinking of putting their children to medicine after the disclosure that one GP in the choice of doctor scheme would get £43,000 a year if the visit fee went up to £2!

HARD TIMES FOR TEACHERS

Compared to the ease and comforts which teachers enjoy, in these days, it can easily be understood from the following news item that those who followed the profession in the early days of the century were far removed from anything like modern conditions. It is an extract from a column headed "Here, There and Everywhere" which appeared in the "Waterford News" of October 14, 1904, and shows what teachers had to contend with in the matter of remuneration, even allowing for the different money values that applied as years went on and seventy years ago.

TRAMORE POST OFFICE IS A TINY LITTLE HOLE IN A CORNER SAYS COUNCILLOR

Proposing a motion standing in his name at the monthly meeting of Waterford County Council in Dungarvan last Monday week that the Council call on the Minister for Posts and Telegraphs to provide a better post office service for Tramore town Mr P. Crotty said that he was in the existing post office in Tramore recently and he could only describe it as a tiny little hole in a corner hidden away from everyone. The place was so small that people had to queue outside in the street often in the rain when they wanted to buy stamps or draw pensions. This was not good enough for a town of 6,000 of a population he said, and they should ask the Minister to provide a more central and larger premises in the town.

Mr C. Curran Chairman pointed out they had already gone on a deputation to the Minister about this but they had been completely turned down.

Mr C. Casey said that they should again ask the Minister to provide a proper post office. Mr T. Healy said that it was an absolute disgrace that Tramore should have to put up with such a post office. A town of its size with such a huge addition to the population in summer time deserved better facilities he said.

Mr Crotty said that towns half the size in other parts of Ireland had bigger post offices. The motion was passed and Council members of the Oireachtas were asked to take it up with the Department.

HEART FOUNDATION MEDISCAN UNIT TO VISIT DUNGARVAN

The Irish Heart Foundation Mediscan Unit will visit Dungarvan from 5th to 7th November and will be located at Arus Brugha during that period. The appointments are mainly for ladies in the 25/65 age group and incorporate a hypertension (high blood pressure) study to determine its level in our community so that preventive measures may be taken. These appointments are limited and to obtain one, ask your local doctor for a referral note. Call to Miss M. Clancy, C.M.O.'s office Arus Brugha, for appointment time. Detailed results of screening will be sent to your doctor in approximately three weeks. Booking commences on Tuesday, 29th October.

Men who were screened at a previous Mediscan visit and who were then in the 40/49 age group are being invited to come for re-screening. They will receive a letter from the Dublin office with full details. This is part of a new international multi-centre study which the Heart Foundation has been invited to join and will be the largest programme of its kind in the world directed towards the prevention of Heart Disease. Unfortunately, due to limited appointments only those men in the above group will be screened during this visit.

IN THE SCHOOLS

During the month of November the schools educational programme will recommence with particular emphasis on smoking exercise and diet. Schools in the Dungarvan area will be visited with lectures and films. As always the thanks of the Irish Heart Foundation is due to the local doctors, Committee members and helpers and indeed to the people in general for their help and co-operation in this vital work the prevention of Heart Disease.

INQUEST ON MACHINERY OPERATIVE ADJOURNED

An inquest into the circumstances surrounding the death of 27 year old Declan Morrissey, Machinery Operative, Aglish and a native of Ballybrissau, Grange whose body was found lying on the roadside at Aglish on Sunday morning June 30, was opened by Dr D Healy, Lismore, Coroner for West Waterford, sitting with a jury at the Courthouse Dungarvan, on last Friday.

At this point the Supt stated that the file in the matter had been submitted to the Attorney General and he asked that the inquest be adjourned pending receipt of instructions.

On the same evening the Coroner also held an inquest into the circumstances surrounding the death of Thomas Walsh farmer, Linstoe Modeligo whose death occurred on Saturday July 13 last. There was no jury.

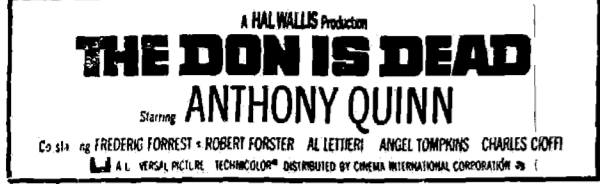

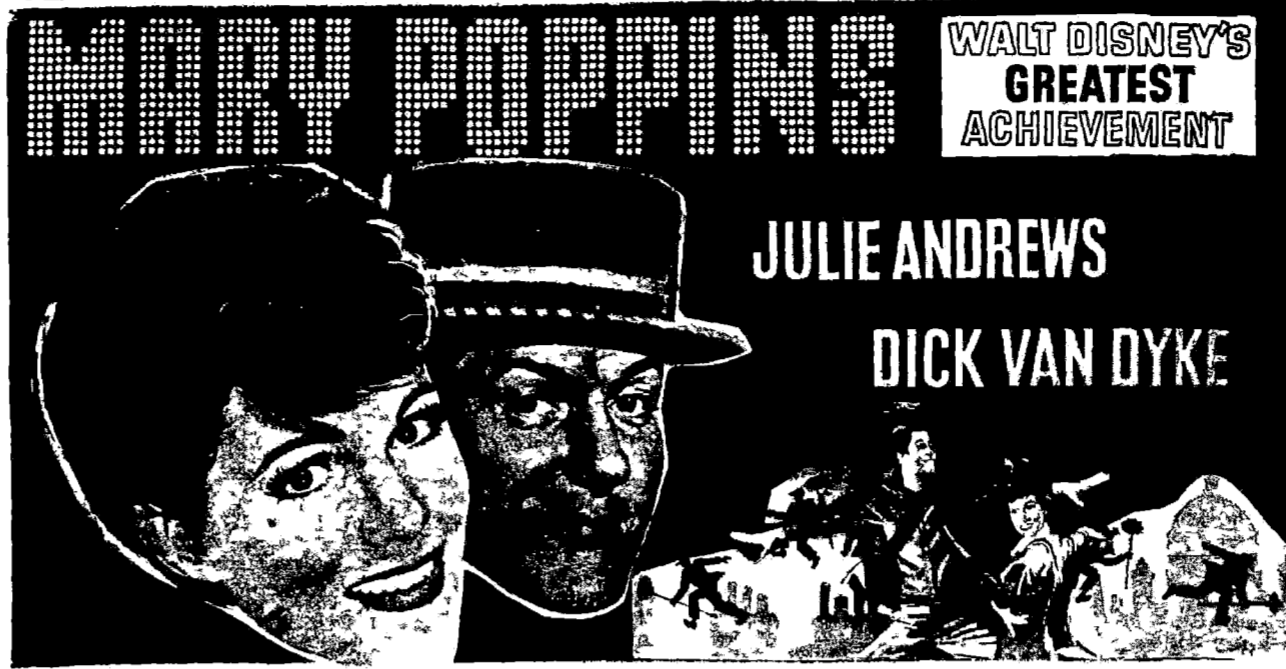
