#### NO SALMON FISHING WITHIN THREE YEARS UNLESS PROBLEM TACKLED NOW

A call to tackle the problem of disappearing salmon stocks on a European basis was made at the monthly meeting of the County Waterford Committee of Agriculture in Dungarvan last Monday It came from Mr P Crotty who said that the matter was so serious that unless steps were taken now there would be no salmon fishing within three years

Mr Crotty said that several

reasons, including overfishing,
were being quoted for the drop
in the number of salmon in
Irish waters He held that despite the dangers of pollution we still had the cleanest rivers in Europe but salmon stocks were still disappearing I think' said Mr Crotty "that the answer to this prob-

lem is to build massive hatcher ies in the rivers and to literally hatch out millions of salmon He went on to say that this was not just an Irish problem but also a European problem and probably a world problem as well It should be tackled on a European basis and Brussels should be prepared to finance the erection of these hatcheries so that the European demand for salmon could be made and the control of the second secon be-met in the years ahead He agreed that Bord Iascaigh Mhara had done great work but he did not thing BIM was big enough to deal with this prob-

lem on its own
Mr Crotty then proposed that
they ask the Minister for
Agriculture & Fisheries to raise the matter in Brussels and to see if he could get backing for the necessary development aid Mr C Curran who seconded Mr C Curran who seconded the motion said that it was one of the most important to be discussed by the Committee as the livelihood of thousands of fishermen depended on salmon fishing There was no doubt but that Mr Crotty was correct when he stated that salmon stocks were facing extermina-tion unless massive conservation steps were taken He thought they could do a lot in this country to help the situation by the proper protection of spawning salmon in rivers during the close season At present he said that salmon were being killed in big numbers during the close season

The resolution was passed

that up to a few years ago when it was closed there was a salmon hatchery in Lismore





# **VOUCHERS** YOUNG CATTLE

The Irish Fresh Meat Exporters' Society Limited, on behalf of its members, has arranged for voluntary contributions from Irish beef exporting factories to help producers of small cattle to purchase feed grain (including beet pulp), or compound feed

Cattle Feed Vouchers will be available to farmers whose land valuation is £50 or less, and whose earnings are derived wholly, or mainly, from farming Qualifying farmers who have calves, weanlings or store cattle and who are seriously short of winter feed are eligible to

The Vouchers will be valued at £7 50 each and will be issued to eligible farmers to assist them in purchasing 5 cwts of feed per voucher The number of Vouchers made available to any farmer will depend on the quantity of feed he needs but will not exceed a total of four Vouchers, or £30, towards the purchase of one ton

Application forms are obtainable from all local offices of the Department of Agriculture and Fisheries and offices of County Committees of Agriculture Applicants should return completed forms to their nearest Farm Development Service (LAND PROJECT) office.
