URBAN ESTIMATE Dungarvan Urban Council will meet next Monday night to consider the estimates for the services in the urban area for the year 1975. In all a total of £152,870 will be required and this is divided as to £51,409 to meet the statutory demand from the County Council and £101,461 to meet the cost of the town services.

Even allowing for the fact that change in any area requires time to get over its teething troubles, the indications are already well established that the new plan is over far less satisfactory than the one it replaced.

A statement from the Urban Council re-considered the position all trade unionists in the town would organise a petition calling on the Council to have two collections made each week.

As further stated that it was not considered a valid point that a reason for the change was the need to service the truck one day each week (on Thursdays).

THE COST While the service for all areas has been halved, people of the town will not doubt with some of a shock, that the cost of scavenging the urban area for the coming year will more than double.

According to the book of estimates which the members of the Council will have before them next Monday night, the cost of scavenging in 1974 (presumably for the 12 months) is given as £67,554. The estimate for 1975 is £16,554. In addition to this will have to be added the cost of street cleaning estimated at £4,291. £500 which is the cost of

providing 20 litter bins at £25 each. This means that the cost of street cleaning and refuse collection in the Dungarvan Urban area throughout 1975 will average more than £400 every week (5 days). One could certainly be excused for wondering from this whether anything like full value for money is being obtained.

NEW HOUSES A letter which I received from a reader in England last week about the Urban Council's new housing scheme at Ringnasillogue (Quann's) in Dungarvan set me seeking information about the present position where these houses are concerned.

My inquiries showed me that the 12 houses which have been allocated have not been so far completed and so cannot be occupied. It was originally intended when the first stage of the scheme covering a group of 30 houses was commenced, to push 12 of them through as quickly as possible.

Because the housing requirements in Dungarvan were so acute and the approved list of applicants ran to well over 100, official pressure was kept on the Department to approve a further batch of houses and because of this, approval for a further 54 was obtained and announced a few weeks ago.

While those who have a little longer to wait are entitled to every sympathy, the position is that they will each have a new house shortly and the small additional delay has enabled the Council to ensure that there will be more houses ready for occupation before 12 months which otherwise might have taken up to 2 years to complete.

EXCUSE OF BEING DRUNK ONLY MADE CASE WORSE SAYS D J

A 22 year old Dungarvan man who took a car without the owner's consent and then started it with a pen knife, was warned by District Justice B J Carroll at Dungarvan Court last week that if he came before him again on a similar charge he would not be going home the same evening

Before the court was Patrick J Fitzgerald, Ballinroad and he pleaded guilty to taking a car at O'Connell Street on the night of March 24 last without the owner's consent

Evidence was given by Garda W Power who stated that he took a statement from Fitzgerald in which he said he and another man tried to take the car Fitzgerald said that he started it by using a pen knife, drove it a few yards and then jumped out and tried to run away

When Fitzgerald told the District Justice he was drunk that night, the Justice said that was no excuse and in fact made the case even worse

OTHER CHARGES Supt M English pointed out that the defendant was presently paying back compensation as a result of his involvement in a number of house-breaking charges

The District Justice said it was high time Fitzgerald began getting a bit of sense Adjourning the charge for one month when other adjourned charges against him would be dealt with he warned the defendant that if he touched another car and came before him he would not be going home the same evening 'You are a most irresponsible man so keep away from cars, otherwise it's prison for you, the District Justice warned
