

## MEDICAL CARDS

SOUTH EASTERN HEALTH BOARD

REVIEW OF GUIDELINES

Every application for a medical services card is considered on its ments. In order to assist the public to know who generally has entitlement to a card the Board publishes from time to time the income guidelines used for assessing eligibility

Persons receiving certain social welfare benefits for which they already had a means test (e.g. non-contributory pensions) can get a card without any further means test

The income counted is the current gross weekly income of the husband and wife only Special allowances are made for high rent and rates or house loans repayments and for reasonable cost of travelling to work

After making these allowances any person can be entitled to a medical card with an income within these
