DOING FOR FLUKE

Sheep and cattle in all areas should by now have received a dose for liver fluke. A second dose is recommended in late January. Dosing for fluke is important this winter when the effects of fluke on individual animals are likely to be severe. This is especially so in areas west of a line from Clones to Galway and in West Cork and Kerry where heavy rain and average infections are expected. It is also recommended that ewes should be dosed up to 6 weeks before lambing or shortly afterwards. This dose can conveniently be combined with a dose for stomach and intestinal worms. This reduces pasture contamination. The same practice is advised for cattle before being turned out to grass.
