During the past twelve months we have heard great deal about the various wavs in which the environs of our country have become and are becoming more and more polluted. We again had discussion on the matter of the County Council meeting in Dungarvan last Monda during when such uncompli mentary remarks as that w are a very dirty people and that because of our dirty habits we are turning th once green isle of Erin into one of the dirtiest countrie in the world were voiced

These are remarks which should shake us but in fac they do not and they appear to just wash off like water of a duck's back That our reaction is so, shows how little we really appreciate the huge problem of pollution and how slow we are to see that already it is assuming proportions which call for urgent action Everyone is agreed about

the sources and cause o pollution and the_high incidence of litter but there are two schools of though as to what should or shoul not be done. One holds that it should be controlled in reasonable way but the othe is prepared to sacrifice al especially if it means more jobs in the rural areas the increase in the use of insecticides, toxic acids and the use of siloge contribute mostly to the pollution o rivers and lakes while in the urban areas, where there has been findustrial development factory effluents are th greatest source of danger while: in all areas the discharge of untreated sewage provides one of the most common pollutants that we

have in this country At the County Council meeting, several members felt that one of the best ways to attack the problems of pollution and litter was through the schools and it was, in fact, agreed to appoint an official to visit the schools regularly to keep children aware of these problems and of the best methods to counteract them
