For years past meetings o Waterford County Council have normally run for two and a half hours on each occasion on which one was held Th commencing time was 230 pm and meetings ran or until 5 pm This, as I say was the accepted procedure for years and caused little o no problem Last June a new Council was elected which saw a number of fresh nev faces on the scene and with the odvent of the new mem bers it appears that the time allowed for holding meeting is now no longer adequate

Within the last couple of manths moves have been made to chop and change meeting times in an effort to meet the new demands. The starting time was brough forward to 2 pm and the finishing time has, by the agreed suspension of standing orders, gone on to 530 pm more than once Last Monda there was another change agreed in a further effort to satisfy—the demands of the new members and meetings will now start at 2-30 pm and go on until 5 30 pm

While there is much to be said for the attitude of those members who want to see the agenda for each meeting completed at one sitting think that the solution does not necessarily lie in extending the times of meetings say this because I can see that a similar problem is being expenienced at meetings of the County Committee of Agriculture and also of the Düngarvan Urban Council Prior to the June elections a couple of hours, at most, sufficed to dispose of the business at the former but recently the meetings have been dragging on for up to
