HOUSEHOLD APPLIANCES

Household appliances can be great labour-savers. But used carelessly, they can be great energy-wasters too.

STORING FOOD

Fridges and freezers are both big energy users. If possible, keep them in a room not normally heated, and open cabinet doors as seldom as you can. Defrost fridges regularly for greatest efficiency. And keep freezers at least three-quarters full for best results.

COOKING

Plan meals to use the oven only or the top only, but not both, together. For instance, a casserole with vegetables and a baked pudding or tart could all be cooked together in the oven. Use saucepans with well-fitting lids. Make sure they're suitable for your type of cooker - don't use saucepans smaller than the hot plates or burners. And cook vegetables in the minimum of water. Fill kettles only with as much water as you intend using - always remembering, of course, to cover the element in an electric kettle. Don't boil a kettle on an electric stove if you've an electric kettle, nor use the grill to make toast if you've an electric toaster. Finally, use a pressure cooker if you have one - it's quicker and less expensive than conventional methods.

LIGHTS

Try confining family activities to one or two rooms in the evening. Use only what light you need, compatible with safety, of course - high wattage for reading and knitting, lower for television viewing or fireside chatting. Give children the switch-off habit all around the house. And when you're changing light fixtures, especially in the kitchen, consider fluorescent fittings - they burn only half the energy of ordinary filament lamps.

APPLIANCES IN GENERAL

Televisions, record players, vacuum cleaners, tumble driers - they're all energy users. So try to be more selective in your viewing and listening. And don't use electrical appliances unnecessarily - especially when a manual operation would be just as efficient.
