HEALTH CENTRE IN DUNGARVAN

At the February meeting of the committee which deals with Community-Care under the South Eastern Health Board a progress report on Health Centres and Clinics stated that the present practice premises at Dungar. van was in such a bad state of repair that alternative accommodation would have to be provided as a matter of urgency

The Programme Manager Dr V Barry, explained to members of the committee that it was hoped that the Board would be able to lease a property which was on the market in Dungarvan for a health centre which would also include accommodation for the Community Care staff and Public Health Clinics

However, Dr Barry said that as this property would not be very suitable and would require an expenditure of £7,000 for alterations he was making enquiries regarding the leasing of a premises from the Bank of Ireland, which was now vocated He express ed the hope then, that he would have further informa tion concerning these premises, which would only accom Photographic panorama of ises, which would only accoming the Social Life from the odate the General Practitioner services for the next meeting

When I mentioned this matter last Monday to Mr Curron who with Mr J Quirke are the two elected representatives of the County Council on the Health Board he informed me that he knew nothing about the proposal and added that as the Health Boards were the most secretive of public bodies in the country, public representatives, in many instances, knew very little of what, in actual fact, was going on

The March monthly meet ing of the Board will be held in Kilkenny on Thursday of this week (the 13th) so perhaps we may learn more of what the proposals for Dungarvan are, after that Incidentally there is a
