PROVISION OF INCUBATOR IN DUNGARVAN MATERNITY UNIT NOT OPPOSED BY DOCTORS

Mr C. Curran, Chairman Waterford County Council and member of the South Eastern Health Board in reply to representations made by him and Mr J. Quirke, the other County Council representative on the Board, concerning the provision of an incubator in the mater-nity unit at St Vincent's (District) Hospital, Dungarvan, has received a letter, dated April 22, from Mr C G Burke Programme Manager, General Hospitals under the Board's jurisdiction, as follows —

"First of all let me say that it is not true that the Dungar-van doctors advised against the provision of this facility the will recall that the provision of the maternity unit at Dungarvan was for cases which could be regarded as entirely normal insofar as the condition of both mother and child was concerned and that the main consultant services for obstetrics and for the care of the new born infant would continue to be provided at Ardkeen"

The letter added that if an infant's condition called for the use of an incubator it would be transported by ambulance to Ardkeen in a portable incubator and it also pointed out that it would be entirely at variance with the originally conceived. purpose of the unit in Dungar-van to maintain a child under care in a incubator there for any significant period of time



SPEED LIMIT TO END SLAUGHTER ON TRAMORE ROAD?

the enforcement of a speed limit of 40 mph at the special meeting of Waterford County Council held in Dungaryan last Monday He said that £1 million had been spent in making this one of the fluest roads in the country but people were being killed on it too often. He said







CAR PARK BYE-LAWS

Waterford County Council Dungaryan last week unanimously adopted a new set of bye-laws which, as soon as they have been sanctioned by the Mmister for Local Government will make it an offence under the Road Traffic Act, 1961 for anyone who uses a car park in any part of the county which comes under the jurisdiction of the Council and who fails to observe them
