## PENSMAN TAKES YOU Behind the SPOTLIGHT

**NO EARLY DECISION ON KILMAECON SCHOOL STATUS**  
 The agitation which has gone on in recent months to have a Leaving Certificate course included in the curriculum of the Kilmaccon Vocational School does not appear to have achieved a great deal of success where the Minister for Education, Mr Richard Burke, is concerned. Replying to questions about the matter which were asked in the Dail about a fortnight ago, Mr Burke stated that while he was concerned about the matter he was prepared to go no further than to say that it would, at least, be a matter of months before he would announce his decision on it.

Mr Burke admitted that the request to provide facilities at the school for a Leaving Cert Course which had initially come from the County Council Vocational Education Committee was under consideration in his department at present. He said that he was aware of the length of time which had elapsed since it was first raised and that he had received deputations from the Vocational Committee to discuss the position.

The Minister then got to the heart of the problem when he stated that at that time he had asked the deputations for an assurance that there would be a certain intake of pupils over a period of years at the school but the records showed "that intake had not materialised". Mr Burke is then on record as saying "I am afraid that as we stand there does not seem to be any adequate cause for a change of policy in the regard. The matter may change over a period of time but I do not see any change in the pattern of attendance at the school at the moment".

When he made these statements, the Minister was replying to questions asked by Mr Jackie Fahey, TD.

**DANGEROUS FOOTPATH**  
 I have been asked to draw attention to the dangerous condition of the footpath running along St Garvan's Terrace in Dungarvan. This footpath was rooted up by the Posts and Telegraph people when they were laying an underground telephone cable from Far Lane corner towards the Hospital. It has been left by them in this condition which is extremely dangerous for pedestrians especially the older and more infirm members of the local community.

Perhaps the County Engineer could see his way to do something as soon as possible to restore the surface of this footpath to its original condition or at least to bring pressure to bear on the Department of P and T to see that it is done.
