TAKING A CHANCE

Despite all the laws and rules laid down to regulate traffic on the road it amazes! me how such a big number of drivers still opt to dice with death by taking a chance Speed limits have been set out and roads have been adequately sign-posted to inform motorists of the restricted zones Equally so have dangerous bends and junctions been sign-posted with either "yield" or "stop"

But, as I say, for many, it is as if these signs never existed On open roads the 60 mph limit is more often broken than observed while the "yield" and "stop" signs apparently carry as little significance for these same people There is a "yield" sign at the traffic island at the Youghal Road corner in Dungarvan for traffic coming from the Connolly Row direction but it might as well not be there at all for all the attention that is paid to it Similarly the "stop" sign at the bottom of Mary Street is almost as much ignored was only last week as I approached this dangerous junction from the O'Connell Street side myself, one even-ing at around 9 o'clock, that a-car shot through the junction at about 40 mph What surprised me most was that the car, full of nuns, was also driven by a holy nun!
