VALUE-ADDED TAX

REMOVAL OF VAT FROM CLOTHING, FOOTWEAR, CERTAIN CLOTHING and FOOTWEAR MATERIALS, AND CERTAIN FUELS.

With effect on and from 1 July, 1975, clothing, footwear, certain clothing and footwear materials, and certain fuels, including electricity, coal, turf, heating oils and piped and bottled gas for heating or lighting, were completely relieved of VAT. The rate was reduced from 6.75 per cent to zero per cent giving a reduction of 6.32 per cent on tax inclusive

The relief applies to all goods supplied on or after 1 July and not paid for before that date It also applies to goods imported on or after that

Details of the relief and of its consequences for registered traders are set out in a leaflet which has been sent to all the traders concerned Additional copies of the leaflet may be obtained from the Revenue Commissioners (VAT), Dublin Castle (Tel Dublin 787911 Ext 238, 319, 155, 268 or 219) and from inspectors of taxes






