

THE CAUSEWAY BRIDGE

I am sure that residents particularly in Abbeyside, will be pleased to note that at last, Waterford County Council have decided to do something positive about the Causeway Bridge linking Abbeyside and Dungarvan For a number of years we have nointed out the mounting dangers which the bridge presents to people who have to negotiate it This is especially so for pedestrians, cyclists and mothers who have to wheel prams and go-cars across it, sometimes several times daily Main opposition to any moves up to this to widen or realign the bridge has been based on aesthetic values and the architectural value of the structure

However the considerable increase in the volume and th weight of the traffic which now passes over the bridge aging to or from Waterford and Cork has called for an urgent solution of the problem Prompted by this, the County Engineer, Mr J D Hally and Engineering Inspectors of the Department of Local Government recently surveyed the bridge and the result of this was a report by de Mr Hally in which five rioptions to deal with the probem were set out
