## Passing Of Eamon De Valera

Eamon de Valera, the revolutionary who shaped the course of the nation and led the march of his people for more than half a century, is dead. His passing marks the end of the beginning of modern Irish history.

He died peacefully at noon on Friday, August 26, after a lengthy life of revolutionary drama, which saw him preside at the birth of the nation, guide it through the perils of a world war and preside over the family of international society.

His passing — scarcely seven weeks before his 93rd birthday — is the end of an era. For the name of Valera so often the name of Ireland, and the name of Ireland so often the name of Valera.

Friday night, the tributes of the mighty poured in from around the globe to the man who started his public life as a simple Volunteer in 1913 and rose to command more power and respect and loyalty than any Irishman of his or any other.

His remains were removed on Saturday from Talbot Lodge in Blackrock to Dublin Castle where they lay in state in St. Patrick's Hall until Monday evening when they were transferred to the Pro-Cathedral. The coffin was borne in solemn procession on an Army gun carriage through the streets of central Dublin.

The State funeral took place on Tuesday last beginning with Requiem Mass at the Pro-Cathedral at 10 a.m. The funeral then took place to Glasnevin Cemetery where the burial took place amid the pomp of a great State occasion — the 21 gun salute, the bands, the Last Post and Reveille, although there was no funeral oration at the graveside. This was the last order from the former President himself.

Thousands lined the route of the funeral procession on Monday evening and again on Tuesday morning while thousands filed past the open coffin lying on the catafalque in St. Patrick's Hall, Dublin Castle, during the lying in state, to pay their own silent respects to the "Chief".

Many tributes and messages of condolence were received from State and Church leaders throughout the world while representatives of many countries were also present at the State funeral on Tuesday.

Special Masses were celebrated in this area on Tuesday for the repose of the soul of Mr. Eamon de Valera at St. Mary's Parish Church, Dungarvan. Masses were celebrated at 8 a.m. and 11 a.m. and on Saturday night a special Mass is being offered at 7.30 p.m. at the request of Dungarvan Comhairle Ceannair Fianna Fail.

## SIXTY YEARS IN PRIESTHOOD

Eighty-eight year old Monsignor Stephen P. Barron, a chaplain in two world wars, celebrated the Diamond Jubilee (60th) of his Ordination, recently, at St. Thomas the Apostle Church, San Francisco. Archbishop Joseph McGuire presided at the Mass.

Msr Barron was born in San Francisco on February 3, 1887, the son of Irish parents, the late Stephen and Bridget Barron. His father emigrated to San Francisco from Coulane, Old Parish. He died in San Francisco having reached the age of 99 years.

Msr Barron was ordained on June 15th 1915 by Archbishop J. Hanna. Having ministered in Centerville, California, and Holy Redeemer Church, San Francisco, he enlisted as a First Lieut. Chaplain in 1917 when World War I broke out and served in Camp Lewis, Washington, as well as in the European Theatre.

After the War he was assigned as assistant Pastor to St. James Church, San Francisco, in 1919 and in 1926 he became Pastor of St. Joseph's Church, Newman, California. Seven years later he became Pastor of All Saints Church, Hayward, California.

Msr Barron was called into active service as Lieut. Colonel Chaplain in 1940—World War II and was stationed at Camp Pendleton, California. He later served in the Alaska Defense Command and in Europe.

He separated from the service with the rank of Colonel in September 1946 and was then appointed Pastor of St. Thomas the Apostle Church, San Francisco, a position he held until his retirement in 1967. On February 21, 1964, Pope Paul VI appointed him a Domestic Prelate.

Msr Barron was first cousin of the late Jim Barron, Tobar, O'Connell Street, Dungarvan, and the late Mrs. Bridget Veale, Ballinaharda Old Parish.

## GARDAI INVESTIGATING £2,000 ROBBERY

Gardaí in Dungarvan, under Supt. Matthew English, are investigating a £2,000 robbery from the licensed premises of "Minnies" at Stansdale North, Abbeyside. The robbery took place during the early hours of Saturday morning last, August 30th.

Entry was gained to the premises at the side of one of the lounges through a window. £1,500 was taken in notes, £500 in silver and the remaining £200 in cheques.
