I was standing in front of the Parish Church awaiting a funeral, in the space of 10 to 15 minutes, cars approaching from the Youghal direction, headed down Emmett Street, obviously in error because eventually they all came back, and having gazed at the sign post, which was of no help whatever the occupants had to ask the byoccupants had to ask the by-standers the way to Waterford or Tramore However, one in-cident very nearly had serious consequences One of those cars who had no idea that one had to take a sudden left turn to remain on the main road, proceeded fairly quickly straight through the junction, at the same time, a car was coming same time, a car was coming up Mary Street and turning right The two vehicles headed straight for one another, and it was only the lost ground it was only the last second swerve of the stranger that avoided a very serious accident All the bystanders (incl myself) got a terrible shock When they regained their com-

posure, they turned on me and demanded that the Council should de something to remedy the situation before somebody is killed there I explained the position to them as well as I could, but it brought home to all of us who witnessed the incident, the absolute necessity of remedying the position right away Now I am sure that it the Engineering Staff of the County Council had witnessed what we did on Saturday evening, they would hardly wait until Monday morning and like the good christians, which they undoubtedly are, they would certainly feel that they would not be breaking the Sabbath, in doing something to try to prevent a serious accident at this

I would like to take this opportunity of thanking my fellow Councillors for the general sup-port which they gave to my proposition However it was decided to defer it to the next meeting of the Council at which the Co Engineer Mr J Hally will be present Now, this meeting will not take place until nearly the end of September and then the County Engineering staff will require time to study my proposals. o study my proposals All in ail, it could take 2 months before anything is done Now, to my mind, and to the minds of the members of the public who were present on Saturday evening, this is just not good enough. Something should be done immediately ...

In conclusion, I want to thank the 'Dungarvan Leader.' the "Dungarvan Observer" and the "Dungarvan Column" of the News and Star for the pub-licity they gave this matter as publicity is vital in matters of this sort

#### **Extension Of Duration** Of Pay-Relation Benefit
