



CALL TO REPLACE LAND COMMISSION Over the past weeks the Land

Commission has come under attack from several sources The Farmers Defence Association, the national representative body for smaller farmers wishes therefore to make its position clear At the present time the land in the hands of the Land Commission amounts to around 100 000 acres (December 1974) and much of this land is in areas designated as con-gested. The proposal put for-ward this week by other farm-ing organisations is that only the "development" farmers be considered for this land. The Farmers Defence Association totally rejects this proposal Since the land is available we believe that it should be put to use in a way that would stabilise the rural community and not accelerate its decline. This can be done, we believe, by the implementation of the following

The Land Commission should be replaced by a Land Board which would have the sole right to buy and sell land This is the only way to halt the steady progress of the professional part-time farmer and land speculator A major portion of agricultural funds should be set aside for the establishment of co-operative farmer of the stablishment of the stablishment of the set aside for the establishment of the set aside for the establishment of the set aside for the set aside for the stablishment of the set aside for the set as co-operative farms of up to 1,000 acres which could be worked and managed by smaller and younger farmers. In this way the smaller farmer can be introduced to economies of scale without being forced out of farming An upper limit of 100 adjusted acres should be set for adjusted acres should be set for all privately owned farms and the Land Board should acquire those over the limit We believe that these proposals along with the others contained in our booklet "In Defence of the Working Farmer," form the best method of restructuring farming in this country HAMPERED




