PENSMAN TAKES YOU Behind the SPOTLIGHT

THE URBAN RATE
As I predicted last week the ratepayers of Dungarvan are in for quite a jolt as a result of the rate which will be required to finance the urban services for 1976. On Monday night the Urban Council, having considered the annual estimates, agreed to strike a rate of £8.19 which is an increase of £1.75 over the amount for the present year. By any standard this is a huge increase and one that is bound to have a big impact on every ratepayer in the urban area.

The rate provides for a total expenditure of £435,485 to meet the cost of the town services for the year, or, on average, a sum of roughly £8.375 per week. Shoppers increases came under the headings of roads, water and sewerage services. The separate rate for roads, jumped by 43p from 67p to £1.10. This service will include £50,000 to start stage 1 of repairs to the quay wall which is planned to continue over a 3 to 4 year period, £16,000 for urban roads (increased from £7,177) and £10,100 for public lighting (up from £7,820 in the current year). An innovation under this heading will be the provision of a Junior School Warden Scheme at the Presentation Convent in Mitchell Street for which an amount of £350 (of which 50% will be recouped from the Department of Local Government) was included.

There has also been a very substantial increase in the cost of operating and maintaining the town water supply which goes up by £11,235 to £29,193. It was stated that the main increases under this heading were accounted for by pumping and electricity charges. Receipts under the heading show an estimated cutback of about £5,000 caused by a drop in demand by one of the principal consumers. The jump under the heading of sewerage schemes was not quite so hefty but still the programme total for this went from £30,730 to £33,070.

Under the heading "Environmental Protection," the separate rate jumped by 29p from 90p this year to £1.19 and this shows that the cost of collecting domestic refuse and street cleaning in the town goes up from £18,818 to £23,158, an increase of £4,340.

One of the most controversial items in the estimate was the inclusion of a sum of £9,000 to cover the first year's installment of principal and interest towards the renovation of the Town Hall which plans the provision of office facilities for the Council staff on the ground floor. The overall cost of this project is estimated at about £45,000 and it is to be paid for over a period of five years. Whether it is worth £45,000 to move the offices from upstairs to the present time when money is so scarce, is a most debatable point. I think that it is a luxury which the ratepayers could have done without at the present time and anyway the question must come up as to whether it is responsible to spend such a lot of money on each an old building.

However the rate has now been struck and nothing more can be done about it except pay it when the demand is made!

GOING UP AND UP
Recent questions in the Dail revealed that the national debt at the last full accounting period, December 31, 1974, had reached the colossal total of £1,958 million, that the cost of servicing it for the year was £180 million and that this worked out at £58 per head of the population. For the current year it is estimated that the cost of servicing the debt (for which figures were not so far available) will run to £234 million or £76 per head of the

Jump of £1.75 in Dungarvan rate

By 7 votes 2 Dungarvan Urban Council at their Estimates meeting last Monday night adopted a rate of £8.19 for 1976, an increase of £1.75 in the current year's rate of £6.44. The new rate which was recommended by the Co. Manager provides for the total expenditure on urban services in 1976 of £435,485 as compared with £371,888 this year (or an increase of £63,597).

The estimates provide for the inclusion of £4,000 in pursuant of the Council's policy to create a "land bank" to fund future land purchases, £2,000 to cover the regular monitoring of the waters in the harbour and £1,500 for cleaning the upper portion of the Sin Lane street. In addition they provide for the expenditure of £8,000 to cover the first stage (to proceed over 3/4 years) period of repairing the quay wall which is to be funded completely out of revenue as no grants will be available and a sum of £3,000 to finance the renovation of the Town Hall and the provision of office facilities on the ground floor which is to be also funded out of the Council's internal revenue sources over a period of 5 years at a total cost of £46,000.

Referring to the increase of £1.75 in the rate, the Co. Manager Mr. C. A. O'Connor in his report to the meeting stated that the level of inflation, deriving from price and wage increases had marked effects on the rate for the coming year. The cost of Sewerage Services continued to increase and there was an additional outlay on the maintenance of water supplies and sewerage disposal plants. The "Total project" accounted for 36p of the total increase and a further 24p was due to the quay wall programme. The mounting costs accounted for 8p of the increase.

The report went on to state: "A satisfactory feature of the estimates is that the Council demand shows a decrease of 20p. This decrease, in the main, derives from the government's policy to phase out the rate contribution for health services over a 4-year period which commenced on April 1, 1975. The housing subsidy will increase to meet the full deficit in 1977."

NOT EXORBITANT
Proposing the adoption of the rate as submitted by the Co. Manager Mr. D. Goode said he did not think the demand was an exorbitant one and he was happy with it. He was aware that they had done their best and that not a single penny could be cut from the estimates. "Of the people seek services," he said, "they must get them and they must be paid for."

The proposal was seconded by Mr. J. Wade. Senator Deasy proposed that a rate of £7.75 be adopted by cutting out the cost of the mounting costs and deferring the Town Hall project for the present. This was seconded by Mr. R. Walsh but was defeated by 7 votes to 2. Mr. Goode proposed that a rate of £8.19 be approved was then declared carried on a similar vote.
